## NEW STEAMER IS CHRISTENED

GLASGOW, June 27.—Mrs. Rene Redmond, daughter of Sir Thomas Shaughnessy, who is spending her honeymoon in Europe, christened the Canadian Pacific British Columbia coast steamer "Princess Margaret," which was launched at the yard of Denny Brothers, Dumbarton, on Wednesday. The vessel is of six thousand tons four hundred feet long and by far the largest of the coast service. The fact that the specifications call for a steaming radius of thousand miles suggests that the boat may be used on the Vancouver-San Francisco run. The "Princess Margaret" is expected to start on the voyage round Cape Horn at the end of August. Her sister ship the "Princess Irene" will be launched at the end of July. Mrs. Redmond was presented with a platinum necklace as a souvenir by the builders.

## THE OPIUM CONFERENCE MEETING AT THE HAGUE

THE HAGUE, June 26.—The international opium conference which has been holding sessions for the past ten days, adjourned yesterday. The conference adopted a resolution requesting Dr. J. London, minister of foreign affairs of the Netherlands, to obtain as soon as possible ratifications from adhering powers necessary to put the convention looking to suppression of the opium traffic into force. This convention was drafted by the conference in 1912. The minister promised to take all necessary steps immediately and congratulate delegates on the progress made.

## KING DENIES REPORT OF ABDICATION

BELGRADE, June 27.—King Peter of Servia had been abdicated. A report, circulated early yesterday, that the Sovereign had determined to retire was set at rest when he declared officially that he had no intention of abdicating. The King left at noon for Vranja where he will take the cure and the baths. Just before his departure he issued a short proclamation announcing that, in accordance with Article 69 of the Constitution the Crown Prince would govern in his name during his absence. The proclamation was counter-signed by the members of the Ministry. The Parliament has been dissolved and elections were called for August 14.
