RIFLE WENT OFF; BULLET FOUND CHUM'S HEART

CORNWALL, May 1—A sad shooting fatality is reported from Alberton. Isaac MacNeil, the 14-year-old son of Angus A. and Mrs. MacDonald, was shot and instantly killed by a bullet from a 22 calibre rifle in the hands of a young comrade, Hector Plunkett. The two boys, along with Alfred McMillan, aged 16, were roaming in the country about a mile from town, when Plunkett's rifle was accidentally discharged, the bullet struck MacDonald near the heart, and he fell into Plunkett's arms. Plunkett had aimed at a bird a moment previously and the afterwards neglected to lower the hammer.

An inquest was held by Senator McMillan and the jury brought in a verdict of accidental death, a rider cautioning young men and boys to be careful in carrying dangerous weapons.
