MANY PAY LAST RESPECTS - Funeral of Mr. J. S. Macdonald, 97-year-old Charlottetown man who died in the Prince Edward Island Hospital Friday after a short illness, was held yesterday afternoon from his late residence, 5 North River Road to the People's Cemetery. Services were conducted by the Rev. G. Carlyle Webster and the Rev. Harvey L. Denton. Many hundreds of citizens attended to pay last tribute of respect to the popular young man who died unexpectedly after being stricken with meningitis on Monday last. Pallbearers were: Messrs. Albert Howat, P. S. Colby, H. L. Bear, L. E. Weimer, W. A. Smith and Dr. Notting. Services at the grave-site were conducted by the Rev. G. C. Webster.

SOFT TRACK CAUSES DERAILMENTS - Difficulty from soft road because of frost leaving the ground had been especially prevalent from the time of the Canadian National Railway men last night. They had two derailments from the soft ground, one on Saturday and one on Sunday. Both were slight and damage to rolling stock not extensive. About midnight Friday a locomotive attached to a freight train left the rails at a siding at St. Charles on the South line. The heavy engine settled deeply in the soft roadbed between the rails and it was necessary to send an auxiliary train and crew from Charlottetown at 3 P. M. The engine was placed on the rails without much difficulty. Regular morning passenger traffic was not disrupted. Saturday afternoon an empty freight car left the rails at Winsloe. The car was replaced shortly after and no delay in traffic caused.

P. thence to the cemetery where his body was interred in its last resting place. It was a glorious resurrection.
