The attention of the police court was occupied all day yesterday with the case against Wallace Carr for the alleged larceny of goods from R. E. Mutch & Co. A large number of witnesses were examined. Benj. Lewis, employed with Carr, said he had sold pickles to Carr early in fall and winter. Mrs. Bertram Carr told that the biscuits and raisins came to her place last fall. Her husband brought in sugar also. William Carr, Wallace Carr's partner, said he had an account with Mr. Mutch. He bought a hbl of sugar last fall from Mr. Mutch. Bert bought 50 lbs from him. Wallace got a hbl of flour. The soap was got in the fall and he knew of it. He knew nothing of the biscuits, lard or cream of tarter or laces complained of. Harry Bridges said the box of biscuits which Carr had purchased at Z. E. McIntyre's store, Daniel McKenzie, clerk at Carvell's, said he had sold Ernest Carr, who boards at Bert Carr's, 18 tins of biscuit like those produced and were delivered at the latter's house. They were to be used for dog biscuit. He charged them to himself as they were not paid for. Bert Carr testified as to the biscuit and sugar. The soap he said he had bought at several places in laying in a supply for the winter. R. E. Mutch (re-called) testified to dealings with Wallace Carr. Wallace L. Higgins, bookkeeper at R. E. Mutch's showed there was no credit sales to Wallace Carr since Dec. 1, 1910, and but one cash sale since that date. Louis Weight, employed in Mutch's warehouse testified that he had sold nothing, with the exception, perhaps, of some oats, to Wallace Carr. The case was adjourned at 5 o'clock until Monday morning at ten o'clock. Peter Scott, drunk, was fined five dollars or ten days and a young girl from the country charged with vagrancy was provided with a railway ticket and sent back to her home on the afternoon train.
