Morality Drive Against Bathing Suits

MONTREAL, April 11 - (CP) - Msgr. T. A. Valois, director of the drive against the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Montreal, against immorality, said today the campaign against women's immodest bathing suits.

Expressing pleasure at the support shown the campaign both in Catholic and non-Catholic quarters so far, Msgr. Valois said the committee had reviewed models submitted by "co-operative" bathing suit manufacturers and the accepted designs would be made public shortly.

So far, he said in an interview, printers turning out calendars and folders which the committee believed salacious had bowed to its request to discontinue use of immodest figures on their publications on the grounds that it is unnecessary for the sale of their products. The request was backed up by a threat of boycotting by supporters of the drive.

Msgr. Valois estimated that close to a million people, mainly Roman Catholics, would back the committee to the limit in its drive against immorality. The diocese's committee has been expressed by numerous other dioceses throughout the province, he said.

"The campaign," he said, "has more than a moral objective: It is patriotic as well. Realizing that the youth of today are to be the heads of families throughout the nation tomorrow, we attempt to foster the proper atmosphere - free of the immorality which is becoming rampant today - in which they can be prepared for their important stations in years to come."

Legion Appeal Re Pensions Act

OTTAWA, April 11 - (CP) - Without reaching agreement, the Commons veterans committee today discussed a Canadian Legion suggestion the Legion proposal, except in cases where the injury or disability results from improper conduct.

An amendment in 1940 deprived all persons of the protection of the insurance principle while on service in Canada. The Legion asked that if the committee did not favor the restoration of the principle it amend the Pensions Act to enable overseas personnel discharged as "medically unfit" to qualify for a "compassionate award of pension."

Col. A. J. Brooks (PC-Royal) moved a motion that the committee adopt the Legion proposal but later agreed to let it stand over.

Capt. Walter Tucker (L-Rosthern), committee chairman, said there were other veterans organizations which intended to make recommendations and representatives of "volunteer" and "conscript" and the committee should hear them before taking action.

Gleason Beale (L-Rimouski) said he felt it would only be "fair play" to hear the case for the conscripts. He approved the insurance principle, but did not wish to see any discrimination against any one who had served in the army.

Considerable discussion arose over the definition of "volunteer" and "conscript" and the committee was told the Legion constitution did not permit men who had been N.R.M.A. troops to become members of the Legion.

BOYS LEARN TO COOK AT AUSSIE'S SCHOOL

CANBERRA, April 9 - (CP) - Australian women who belong to the good husbands-are-trained-club have taken heart for their daughters at the recently announced curriculum for potential husbands at the high school here. Here boys of the class of 56 learn to cook and wash clothes while the girls turn an efficient laundress or a pretty hatchet.

The principal arranged the classes as a temporary measure to teach the girls and boys what each other did during their technical and domestic science classes. When he arranged for the pupils to revert to their normal classes the boys and girls sent deputations to urge him to continue the switch-over. The principal said: "Each of the boys brought to school a solid shirt and washed and ironed it. Then they each darned a sock and did some cooking. The girls made themselves coat-hangers, metal poker and other small articles in our workshop. We will continue the special classes for these pupils who want them. Parents have congratulated us on the idea. One mother particularly asked to have her son taught how to make a bed."
