FOR INDUSTRIAL FARMS.—Yesterday a delegation of the Children's Aid Society consisting of Mr. A. A. McDonald, President, Canon Simpson, Father Maurice McDonald and Rev. Dr. Fullerton waited on the Government and presented the necessity for the establishment of Industrial Farms for the correction and training of delinquents committed by the Juvenile court. At present in all such cases the province is compelled to resort to such institutions as may be found in other provinces. This has been felt to be a very severe handicap in the work of the Society for the saving of young criminals. After the delegates had presented their case, which they thought would call for an annual expenditure of about \$5,000 from the government and initial outlay on the part of the people of the province of some \$10,000 for the securing and equipping of the Homes, the government promised to take the matter into their careful consideration.
