SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

THIRD QUARTER.

LESSON I. MALIGNANT UNBELIEF. JULY 7.

Mark 3:20-35.

GOLDEN TEXT.

"This is the judgment, that light is come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, for their works were evil."—John 3:19.

POINTED SUGGESTIONS.

By Rev. D. W. Snider.

The scene and story in the life of our Lord which the lesson has under review pulsates with intense and exciting interest. No argument or strife of tongues on the political platform, no pressing, inquisitive rabble gathered about the person of a contestant whose fame has been put in peril could be more alluring to the love of the sensational than is in us. The parallel passages in Matthew and Luke must be studied at the same time.

When affairs are at the crisis strong words and decisive actions come into evidence. They do not fail when Jesus is pressed by the circumstances which malignant opposition creates for Him. In His supreme and divinely dignified way He meets the occasion and routs His enemies. His logic is irresistible. His purpose is steadfast. His spirit is filled with the loftiness of the holy and the loving, and the crowding throngs are left to marvel, saying, What manner of man is this? And there is only one honest answer to the question. He is the Messiah.

It is not to be wondered at that men thought that Jesus was beside himself—mad. That was the horn of the dilemma they would take rather than confess themselves insane, for they could not consider their mental judgments to be on an equality. They chose to call Him queer, eccentric. That, they thought, was the charitable thing to do, and in their charity some thought to save Jesus from Himself.

But there were others who cut between and charged that Jesus had willfully put Himself under the power of the prince of the devils. That attitude, which was begotten by the spirit of hatred, created an issue. The lesson tells how it was met.

Note, first, the passionless but resistless severity of the logic of Jesus. Abraham Lincoln made use of it, in the critical hour of United States politics in his never-to-be-forgotten speech called "The House-Divided-Against-Itself-Speech."

Note again: Jesus claims power and easy supremacy over the power of the devil. He can, and has, and will drive him forth from the possession of men. He can bind him and clean out the house he has occupied and live there himself. The spiritual implications of such a claim make it such that men who continue to live in sin are sinners, indeed. It means they suffer the domination of evil where Jesus is willing and has power to reign. The Castle of Man-soul should belong to Him.

The unpardonable sin: Many classes will doubtless spend unto wastefulness most of the precious time of the lesson in vain questioning over this portion of it. Certain facts will remain, viz: There is an unpardonable
