Movie Made By Hand In London

LONDON, Sept. 11.—The first motion picture film ever to be made without a camera was shown to the public here under the auspices of the Post Office. It consisted of colored patterns which moved in tempo with a rumba played on the sound track of the film. The patterns were applied directly to the film by hand. The invention was made by an Australian artist, Len Lye, who sought by use of a film to avoid the mechanical difficulties encountered in providing a color accompaniment to music by means of electric lights. The Post Office has ordered other films of the same nature, which will be used to advertise its services.

Anglican Fund Nears Objective

WINNIPEG, Sept. 11.—Success for the Anglican Restoration Fund is in sight. Canon S. Gould of Toronto, director of the fund and General Secretary of the Church of England Missionary Society, announced here. "We have collected over \$700,000 in cash and funds toward the \$771,000 that was lost," he reported. "About the end of the three-year period we set ourselves, which expires the second Sunday after next Easter, we will be all caught up." In addition, Canon Gould reported that about \$90,000,000 has been collected toward the Special Maintenance Fund to pay stipends, salaries, etc., which is to replace the funds for that purpose, also lost with other funds through defalcations three years ago. Canon Gould is en route to Calgary to attend the annual meeting of the Anglican Synod there the week of Sept. 15.

BARGAIN EXCURSIONS TO WESTERN CANADA

Autumn proving a popular travel time the Canadian National Railways has announced another series of bargain fares to Western Canada, between September 21 and October 4. The fares will be in effect from all stations in Eastern Canada, including the Maritime Provinces, up to and including Port Arthur and Armstrong, and all stations west. Tickets will be good going any time between September 21 and October 4, inclusive, and provide a generous limit for the return movement of 45 days in addition to the date of sale. Three classes of accommodation will be provided for these excursions—approximately one cent a mile in each direction good in coaches only, with a slightly higher fare good in tourist and standard sleeping cars. Excursions within the limit of the ticket will be permitted at all stations Port Arthur, Armstrong and west both going and returning. With the excursions taking place at an attractive time of the year, it is anticipated that these low fare rates will prove most attractive to those wishing to visit Western Canada.

AUSTRALIA GROWS LESS WOOL

Australia's wool clip for the 1935-36 season is estimated at 2,930,000 bales, or 216,000 bales (66 1-2 million lbs.) fewer than the estimate for the season just ended. The Queensland clip will probably account for 150,000 bales of the reduction, states the Australian Press Bureau.

Longer Time Allowed West Indies Cruises

MONTREAL, Sept. 10.—Extension of the time of Canadian National Steamship cruises to the West Indies, without extra cost to the passenger, has been announced by Victor Eke, Passenger Traffic Manager of Canadian National Steamships, commencing Thursday, October 24th, the popular "Lady" liners on the Eastern service to Bermuda, the Leeward and Windward Islands, Barbados, Trinidad and Demerara will sail from Halifax via Boston every second Thursday for the balance of the Fall season and throughout the winter season. The additional time is accounted for by the fact that the round-trip voyage, Halifax to Demerara, will now take 32 days instead of 30 days. "The popularity of our summer and fall cruises decided us in maintaining the present regular summer rates, also cruise rates, up to the end of the year," Mr. Eke stated. "The October schedule change will permit a popular six-day cruise to the beautiful island of Dominica. The change also permits additional time ashore for cruise passengers in Barbados, Trinidad and Demerara. Arriving at Demerara at six o'clock Friday morning they will remain until six o'clock the following Sunday morning." With the winter schedule of the "Lady" steamers from Halifax on November 28th, is inaugurated a weekly Thursday departure from Halifax via Boston, alternating so that one week sailing will be to Bermuda, Nassau and Jamaica and the alternate week's sailing down the Eastern route to Demerara. All five of the "Lady" boats will reach Bermuda on Mondays at 2:00 p. m. This schedule makes possible a 12 day Bermuda cruise allowing the passenger ten days ashore or five days ashore with a ten day cruise from Boston to Bermuda or "a week and two weekends."

China Pleasing Pottery Clever

(By The Canadian Press) TORONTO, Sept. 11.—One of the attractive cases in the Women's Building at the Canadian National Exhibition contains an exhibit of china and tile painting prepared by the Ceramic Club of the Lyceum Women's Art Association. The exhibit, arranged by Miss Eva C. Moore, contains many modern signs in treatment of decorated china plates, cups, saucers and tiles. Among the most pleasing pieces is a lamp base, the design of which is made of the motifs from the Chinese Emperor's robe in the Royal Ontario Museum. Another striking piece is a royal blue plate decorated with gold in an extremely simplified and modern pattern. A tea set in white and silver has a decoration of silver silver bars which conform perfectly to the mould and form of the articles. The delicate workman-ship forms an interesting contrast to the neighboring display of Canadian pottery, which aims also at modern simplicity. Texture and character of the clay is not lost in the clever designing and beauty of the handbuilt pieces. One competitor has succeeded in getting a rich, deep blue in the glass, and another a delectable green in a bowl with a lettered decoration. Many visitors have commented upon a unique and original piece in the form of an open-mouthed fish.
