CITY OWNERSHIP IN NASHVILLE.

Nashville, Tennessee has over 80,000 people and is a growing city. It had a street railway, gas and electric light system owned and operated by companies, and grew tired of their high charges and mismanagement.

The big fight appears to have been over the electric lighting question. The Cumberland Electric Light Company, made up of several companies consolidated in one, was charging the city \$85 each for street lamps, nominally of 2000 candle power, but really much less, and it was claimed that from 20 to 25 per cent of the lamps were not kept lighted.

The city provided for lighting on a much more extensive scale than the company, and its plant, with extensions cost in all \$198,803. The plant has now been in operation a sufficient time to demonstrate beyond question that it is a profitable investment.

The city lighting bill was formerly \$47,000 for 382 inferior arc lights and 200 gas lights in the city buildings, and it now pays only \$40,000 for 612 arc lights and 1,800 incandescent lamps, and in the homes and business places of the people electricity for light and power is obtainable at less than one-third of its former price.
