NEW YORK, Aug. 13.—In the refrigerators of the American liner New York when she sails for London to-morrow there will be 36,000 dozen of eggs, the first American eggs to the English markets since the beginning of the European war. The eggs cost here twenty-five cents a dozen.

KEEPING CLEAR

TRADE ROUTES

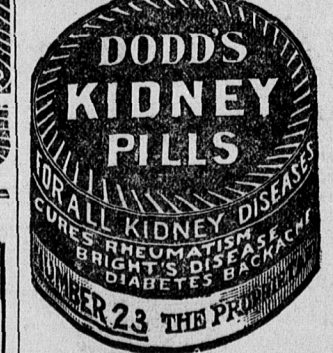
LONDON, Aug. 14.—The Admiralty has sent out cruisers which will ply in the Atlantic for the purpose of protecting trade routes. The French Government also has sent out warships to search for German cruisers known to be in the Atlantic. "Enemy's ships" says the official Admiralty report, "will be hunted continually and although some time may elapse before they are run down they will be kept too busy to do much mischief." A number of fast merchant vessels fitted and armed at British Arsenals are also patrolling the routes and keeping them clear of German Commerce Raiders. With every day that passes British control of trade routes, especially those on the Atlantic, becomes stronger. In the North Sea, where Germans have scattered mines indiscriminately and where the most formidable operations in naval war are proceeding, the Admiralty gave no assurance.

GERMAN ADVANCE

LONDON, Aug. 13.—The Admiralty and War Office Informant on Bureau issues the following: "An engagement is in progress northwest of Hasselt, Limburg, between a Belgian cavalry division supported by a Brigade of Infantry and the German second cavalry division, 250,000 strong, supported by a battalion of infantry and twelve pieces of artillery. The German Fourth Division is reported moving towards Jodigne, Brabant, a Province of Belgium. The German Infantry is known to have left the Bank of the Meuse except the above mentioned battalion. Germans are entrenching at Aise. The Forts are holding out. The Germans are constructing a railroad between Liege preparatory to a siege. Heavy guns have been heard. The Germans are constructing a railroad between Vise and Honburg parallel with the frontier of Dutch Limburg. They are also entrenching themselves at Aise. Huy March and Moufflaine are points held by German Cavalry. Columns of German Cavalry are moving East toward the Valley of the Our. The French retreat from Muelhausen was well carried out. The proportion of opposing forces was four Germans to each Frenchman. The German Field Artillery proven far inferior to that of the French.

BATTLE IMMINENT

NICH, Serbia, Aug. 13.—That a big battle is imminent between Austria and the forces of Serbia and Montenegro is indicated in a statement from the Serbian War Office. A correspondent at Nich says the Serbians and Montenegrins are taking the offensive against Austrians and Hungarians. A number of Austrians who crossed the River under cover of darkness were either slain or captured.

WAR OFFICE ANNOUNCES

ENGAGEMENT IN PROGRESS

ST. PETERSBURG, Aug. 13.—Following the official communication issued August 10 and 11 the enemy made a careful reconnaissance on the frontiers of the Governments of Kovono and Suaki. German detachment of four battalions, three squadrons of cavalry and eighteen cannon attacked Eydtkuhner but were repulsed. The communication gives details of a number of small frontier affairs.

GERMAN STEAMER CAPTURED

NEW YORK, Aug. 13.—Confirmation of the report that the German Tank Steamer Leda had been captured by British Cruiser was brought here today by the steamer Bermudian from Bermuda. The officers of the Bermudian said when they left Bermuda the Leda was the only prize then in port.

PRINCE OF WALES FUND

LONDON, Aug. 13.—The Prince of Wales funds for the relief of families of war victims passed \$4,000,000 mark yesterday.

GERMANY'S RESERVES

ST. PETERSBURG, Aug. 13.—It is reported that Germany has formed 25 reserve divisions, each of 20,000 men, and six batteries with 31 reserve cavalry regiments, which constitute the main part of the German forces on the Russian frontier.

ON RUSSIAN FRONTIER

ST. PETERSBURG, Aug. 13.—Austrian troops on the Russian frontier have been placed under command of a German General. The news is confirmed that certain divisions of the Austrian forces, comprising Tyrolean and Czech regiments have been transported to French territory.

BALMNAL FOR A HOSPITAL

LONDON, Aug. 13.—King George has offered Balmoral Castle as a hospital for wounded soldiers.

LOSSES DENIED

LONDON, Aug. 13.—Belgium was today again the scene of outpost fighting between Belgians and French and Germans. The German Commander at Liege denies the loss of 20,000 in his efforts to take the Forts there. He says they will be taken without loss of men as soon as Germany's heavy artillery arrives. He asserts that the Belgians were numerically superior to ours. He intimates that the assaults were stopped to prevent needless sacrifice of life.

On the subject of Liege the French Foreign Minister declares all surrounding Forts are intact and that only a small force of Germans entered the town itself under cover of darkness.

HORSE NOTES

Local horse men are very much interested in the very handsome and speedy stallion which Mr. George Handrahan has brought with him from the West. Harry T. is by Zomero 211, one of the greatest sons of the great McKiney. Harry T. raced through the western circuit last year and was a consistent and very fast trotter, winning the majority of the stakes for which he started, among them being some of the value of \$2,500. He finished with a record of 2:16 and looked to be good for 2:12. He has been carefully prepared for the year and is right now capable of stopping along up to his mark. Mr. Handrahan has given him slow work since bringing him here, but will let him buzz in a week or two. Horsemen will be greatly interested in seeing this great trotter from the far west pitted against our local speed brigade. The meeting between him, Oakley H. and Dr. Sharper should prove very interesting.

An Island horse which is making good abroad is Reelight, raised and formerly owned by Duncan Robertson. North River. He is now owned by L. A. Simpson, of Amherst, and was the winner of the 2:23 pace event at Halifax during the firemen's tournament, taking a record of 2:24 on a very slow track. Reelight is said to have worked trial miles in 2:16 and is looked upon as a very classy horse for the fall stake races. He will race at Charlottetown during Exhibition week.

Hammond Kelly is preparing his stallion Mayor Todd for the fall stake races. Mayor Todd is a very fast trotter—in fact, exceptionally so, and if no accident should befall, he should be capable of feeling off a mile in 2:20 quite easily.

Baron Cecil, 2:21, well-known to local horsemen, has been sent to Peter Carol, Halifax, to be prepared for his fall engagements. The Baron will be a starter in the 2:19 and 2:22 trot at Charlottetown Exhibition races in the fall.

March BeVe, the two-year-old filly by Baring out of Orwell Belle, 2:23, did a mile in 2:45 over the Elafax track last week. She is said to be a very promising trotter.

RUSSIAN ROYALTY

AT THE FRONT

ST. PETERSBURG, Aug. 13.—It is stated that Grand Duke Nicholas Michaelovitch will soon join the active army and it is believed most male members of the Imperial family will follow his example. Grand Duke Constantine has endowed a field hospital with fifty beds. The Grand Duchess and Marie and Helene have volunteered as hospital nurses.

FRENCH NOBLEM

WERE KILLED

LONDON, Aug. 13.—A despatch from Paris says that it is rumored there that sons of Duke Malle, members of the French nobility have been killed by Germans in the Duchy of Baden.

DECISIVE DEFEAT

OF AUSTRIANS

(Canadian Press.) PARIS, Aug. 13.—St. Petersburg despatch to the Matin reports the decisive defeat of the Austrians by Russian troops at Diester River. It says 4,000 infantry and 8,000 cavalry were routed.

THE FRENCH POSITION

LONDON, Aug. 13.—The French Foreign Minister described the French position in Alsace as good, as the troops occupy the crests and passes of the Vosges Mountains.

A MIGHTY ARMY

LONDON, Aug. 13.—Whit flying scouts of the German Cavalry are penetrating Belgium, a mighty German Army of more than 400,000 are marching Southwestward from Liege towards the French Borders to strike the frontier fortification of France at the weakest point. Advice from the war scene are meagre indicating that the German War Lord is determined not to allow the resistance of the Allies around Liege to prevent the immediate invasion of France.

It is reported that 8,000 German troops have invested Namur. Today news from the war seems more convincing and most of the despatches allowed to come through show evidence of the censor's work, either on the continent or in London, to conceal the real military situation.

GERMANS WITHDREW

BRUSSELS, Aug. 13.—Despatches received by the Belgian War Office state that the German Forces operating before Liege have withdrawn to the Bortward and taken defensive positions. A string of German forces patrol city.

AUSTRIA AND ENGLAND

LONDON, Aug. 13.—The foreign office announces that a state of war exists between Austria and England from midnight and official arrangements have been made for the Austro-Hungarian Ambassador and staff to leave London tomorrow.
