CRIME IS ON INCREASE, SAYS DOMINION REPORT

OTTAWA, Aug. 15.—That crime is still on the increase in Canada is the inference to be drawn from the criminal statistics for the year 1921, just issued. The total number of convictions for indictable offenses increased by 53 or 5.2 per cent, and of non-indictable offenses, by 13,439, or 9.3 per cent. In offenses against the person, including murder, manslaughter and crime against decency there were increases in the number of charges, the only decreases being in three out of six classifications.

There was a heavy increase in charges of driving automobiles while drunk, the convictions increasing from 48 to 142. Carrying weapons unlawfully increased from 48 to 142. Carrying weapons unlawfully, increased from 156 to 259, a fact which may be coupled with the increased in burglary and robbery.

Hilder, M.P. for Essex; Sir Edwin Cornwall, M.P. for Bethnal Green, and his daughter and Lord Stratford.
