### THE CENTRAL GUARDIAN

IT PAYS to buy in this Province.

(From Saturday's Evening Guardian) **PLEASANTLY ENTERTAINED.**—The Amberst News of the eighth contains a short item in reference to the entertainment of the Christ Church choir of their kind hospitality to Mrs. Dibbles. An enjoyable evening was passed in music and song and a charming supper served. Prof. Wright in well chosen words thanked the host and hostess on behalf of the choir for their kind hospitality, to which the rector made a suitable reply. The entertainment ended with the singing of Auld Lang Syne and the National Anthem.

**POlice COURT.**—At the Charlottetown Police Court this morning, four cases against merchants in the city for selling adulterated Maple Syrup were disposed of, a fine of \$16 being imposed on each one. Wm. H. Ford on a charge of drunkenness was fined \$2 or five days.

**P. W. C. REOPENS.**—The Prince of Wales College, Charlottetown has again reopened after the Christmas holidays with an enrollment of two hundred and seventy-five before Christmas. Consequently it will be seen that about thirty-five have secured Third Class Licenses.

**DISCHARGED SCHOONER.**—The following men returned from Souris yesterday where they have been discharging a schooner of molasses from the Schooner Hazel Treahay, consigned to Nicholson and Messervey, Charlottetown.—Michael Power stevedore; James Power, longshoreman; Dr. Coughlin, Peter Whitty, and John Casford. While in Souris they stayed at the boarding house of Mr. George Roach and speak in highest praise of the courtesies extended to them by the firm of Matthew and McLean, Souris.

**RESUMED OPERATIONS.**—The plant of Messrs Bruce Stewart & Company Limited which has been closed down for the past two weeks for general repairs has again resumed operation. This is the first time the plant has been closed since its commencement over twenty years ago. A new steam boiler has been installed and the shafting has all been overhauled. A new copula has also been installed in the Foundry and many other repairs of a general nature have been made.

**PRACTICAL WORK.**—In the second lecture in home nursing given to the members of the Household Science Department of the Short Course Emergencies were dealt with—a list of the remedies for these were given, and the appliances which should be in every household; the home treatment of cuts, burns, scalds, bruises, fractures, faints, etc. Following this, came a talk on bandages, the kinds, their uses, different shapes, and points to remember in their application. A demonstration then made clear the foregoing and members of the class practised the making and use of bandages for finger, hand, arm, elbow, shoulder, eye, also the sling for an injured arm.

**AUTOMOBILE SCHOOL.**—There are up to the present forty-five enrolled in the Automobile School which has been established in Charlottetown under the auspices of the Young Men's Christian Association and which was opened this week. The school is being conducted at the garage in Great George Street of the Island Motor Supply Company, and is in charge of Mr. Miller, an expert in motor cars from the United States. Of the forty odd, who are all taking the full course of the school, only eight are owners of cars, the others being persons desirous of qualifying as chauffeurs. The school is divided into three classes; a day class, which meets morning and afternoon and is made up of the younger men and largely of those from out of town; and two night classes, one meeting on Monday and Thursday nights, and the other on Tuesday and Friday nights. The first Friday night class was held last night. The same line of work is taken up in each class. The night classes will take nine weeks to complete the course, while the day class will be finished in three or four weeks. In conversation with a Guardian reporter yesterday, Mr. C. J. Reilly, the Secretary of the Y. M. C. A., in reply to the question, "Is this number that you have on the rolls sufficient to guarantee or to warrant the maintenance of the school?" said: "Yes. We don't know what will happen at the end of this school, but we anticipate there will be enrolments enough to form new classes as soon as these are through." It may be stated that the present Friday night class is absolutely full. Two cars are at the disposal of the school for demonstration purposes, while several owners have agreed to lend their cars for illustration as to different types of engines.

**THE TRAINS.**—The snow storm of last night and today did not stop the progress of the eastern or southern trains of the P. E. I. R., in fact the snow ploughs were not even needed. On the western branch it was different, however, and some detention was experienced. The trains got through from Tignish to Summerside with little difficulty, but from that in to Charlottetown the storm seemed to increase. The morning train from Tignish and Summerside, which was equipped with a Snow Plough and Planger, was detained about two hours on account of the storm. This was not the first time that snow ploughs were needed on the western branch and the snow that had fallen previously helped considerably to detain the trains. However, the night train from Summerside will have a clear track and will be able to arrive in Charlottetown on time.
