The highest temperature registered yesterday was fifty-seven above zero. At nine a. m. the mercury stood at fifty-five and at nine p. m. at fifty point above. The coldest recorded the previous night was fifty-four above.

Last night New Wonderland was literally packed with a most appreciative audience, and numbers of our militiamen in their bright uniforms helped to brighten up the scene. He sang "Is it warm enough for you" with grand effect, his magnificent baritone being heard in the furthest part of the large auditorium, and he had to respond to repeated encores at each appearance.

There was no noticeable change in the run of produce or prices at the City market yesterday, the only exception being wild strawberries, the first of the season, which sold at ten cents a tumbler. White and black oats sold at fifty eight cents a bus for the former and sixty cents for the latter. Butter sold at sixteen and twenty cents a lb, eggs at sixteen to eighteen a doz, and potatoes at thirty two cents a bus. The hay and straw markets were dull, loose hay selling at forty-eight to fifty cents a cwt. and pressed at nine dollars a ton, while pressed straw sold at five dollars a ton and loose at twenty-five to thirty a cwt. The fish market was good.
