 Parties requiring space by above steamers are requested to communicate at once with

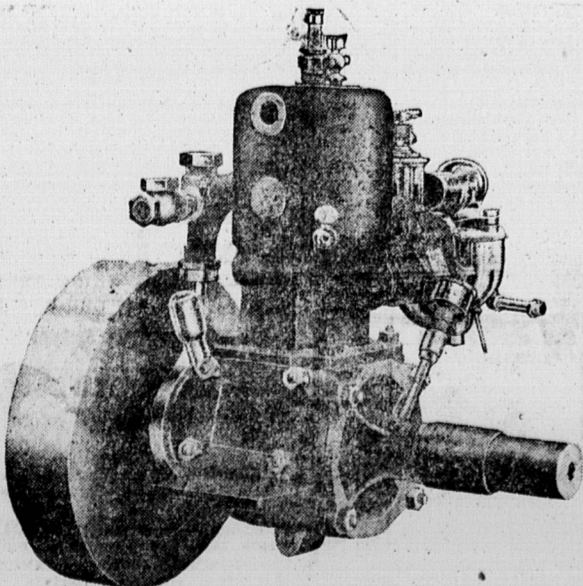

 —Arthur Owen, Hamilton, was in Summerside Saturday.

 —James A. Morrison, Summerside, shipped seven thousand pounds of smelts since the 8th inst.
 —Nearly five tons of smelts are shipped from Summerside every trip of the Empress, by express to Boston.
 —Miss Florence Morrison, North Bryon, has returned home from a pleasant visit in Boston with her aunt, Mrs. Neil McDonald and other relatives.
 —The work of erecting Summerside's new skating rink is being pushed along rapidly. The heavy trusses are now all in position. The building is two hundred feet long and one hundred feet wide, and when completed should give ample room for all.
 —A few days ago Alexander Gallant, Urbanville, lost two cows by being poisoned with Paris green. Some evil disposed person took potatoes and cut holes in them and inserted Paris green, then carefully plugged up the holes and gave them to the cows in Mr. Gallant's stable. One of the potatoes slipped beyond the animals' reach and thus was left to tell the tale.
 —John M. Clark, Summerside, who has a large contract from the Dominion Government for the Railway Wharf Charlottetown, spent Sunday at his home. Mr. Clark reports that he expects to have the work of his contract completed in less than two weeks. When this warehouse is completed it will be the largest one in this Province being 200 feet long, and seventy feet wide. It is placed on piles driven through the wharf structure, most of them a distance of fifty feet down to the solid formation.
