#### AFTER SECRET GAMBLING.

WINDSOR, Feb. 19.—Rev. F. W. Hollinrake, pastor of Central Methodist Church, will appear before the Windsor Police Commission at a special meeting shortly and lay before that body all the information he has about gambling in Windsor. Pastor Hollinrake created quite a stir in Windsor last Sunday when he preached on "Big Windsor honeycombed with gambling, and do the police know about it?" The Police Commission is composed of Judge M. A. McHugh, Mayor Clay, Magistrate Leggett and Chief Willis.

Added to this information upon which he based his sermon Sunday evening, Mr. Hollinrake says that he already has the statement of another ex-gambler, who has verified every statement made. Mr. Hollinrake said there were eight gambling houses in Windsor.

#### DROWNING MAN'S FAREWELL.

DUBLIN, Feb. 19.—Describing at the inquest his efforts to save Captain Cameron, who was drowned in Waterston Lake, Athlone, on Sunday night through the capsizing of a boat from which they were fishing, the gamekeeper stated that a large fish which had been caught jumped in the boat and in making a grab at it Cameron stumbled and upset the boat. The witness swam to him and assisted him to the boat. It rolled over again, and Cameron, missing his hold, went down and came to the surface again. He shook hands with the witness, saying "Good-bye, Meark; it is all up with us." Then he sank and had not been seen again.

SCHOONER TWO MONTHS ON HER TRIP TO BOSTON.

BOSTON, Mass., Feb. 20.—With samples of mud from almost every harbor between here and Parrsboro, N. B., clinging to her anchors, the little British schooner Klondyke edged into Boston on the skirts of a gale that evidently had been pursuing the conister to administer a sharp warning to keep in winter quarters till bluebirds and swallows come again.

For two months the schooner had been on the passage to this port dodging gales pretty much all the time. Her owners had been tempted to venture a trip with a cargo of lumber because rates are quite high here, but they could not deliver the cargo without getting the vessel into trouble provided he took time and sailed only during good weather, so the Klondyke occupied about sixty days in covering the distance.

BUILDERS' CONVENTION.

CALGARY, Alta., Feb. 18.—Builders from all over Canada in their seventh annual convention assembled and opened their sessions today. Notice was given to the effect that a motion would be introduced calling for the division of the association into two parts, an east half and a west half. The object of this measure, which will probably be passed as there is a great deal of sentiment in favor of it, is to solidify to a greater extent the organization of builders in Canada so that they will be better able to deal with the various unions which it was pointed out are becoming stronger all the time.

BIG TIMBER DEAL.

WINNIPEG, February 19.—A transaction that promises to have very far-reaching effects was consummated a few days ago, whereby the Grain Growers' Company purchased timber limits near Fort George, British Columbia, comprising about 300,000,000 feet of lumber, at a price of about \$1.50 per 1,000 feet.

It is said to be the intention of the Grain Growers to hold this as a re-issuing supply with the idea of establishing lumber yards at different points in the province for the purpose of supplying farmers and settlers with lumber at reasonable prices.

MADERO'S BROTHER COLLAPSES.

ITHACA, N. Y., February 19.—Evaristo Madero, brother of the former President of Mexico and of Gustavo Madero, collapsed when he was shown a despatch today telling of his brother's execution. He retired to his room in the Spanish-American Club at Cornell University and for some time would not admit his friends. Only a few days ago he received a reassuring cablegram from his sister-in-law, the wife of Gustavo Madero. He could not believe today's news at first, he said.

Madero graduated from Cornell State College of Agriculture this week and will leave at once to join his sister-in-law, who is in Monterey.

GERMAN PETROLEUM MONOPOLY.

BERLIN, Feb. 19.—A trade convention, representing the German chambers of commerce, passed a resolution today in favor of the German Government's petroleum monopoly bill on condition that it is based on guarantees of an adequate supply and made the prices with compensation for the middlemen and employees affected by the consolidation. The resolution, however, was strongly opposed by a powerful minority in the convention.

SLUMP IN MUMMIES.

LONDON, February 18.—One of the few classes of antiquities of which prices have not yet lifted beyond the means of middle-class collectors is Egyptian relics. It will be remembered that at the sale of the collection of Egyptian antiquities that belonged to the late Lady Meux the prices realized for her curious collection of mummies, carvings and miscellaneous art objects from Egypt brought surprisingly poor prices.

Within the past few days another sale has been held here of Egyptian antiquities. It was that of the de Rusta collection, which was regarded as one of the finest private collections of the kind in the world. There was some eager bidding for some of the pieces, but on the whole, the prices were not high. As one dealer expressed it, there is at present "an awful slump in mummies." Private collectors bore away the choicest relics, but several museums, including the British Museum, enriched their Egyptian rooms at the sale.
