VERY SEVERE WEATHER IN THE UNITED STATES.

NEW YORK, Feb. 12—The cold snap which made its presence suddenly felt early yesterday in the eastern section of the country is still sending the mercury down to lower figures than have prevailed for many years.

In some localities, notably Northern New York, the thermometer was beyond the record of years. But late yesterday the thermometer was rising somewhat to near the nominal weather average.

The effects of the abnormal temperature are still felt however in train blockades in the up-State sections where snow accompanied the cold. The blockade is so far, only partially raised while the ice barriers at harbors along the coast make navigation difficult and in some places impossible.

New York harbor today is about as nearly ice bound as it ever gets as a result of several cold snaps and the surface of the bays are thick with heavy ice floes. Navigation is extremely difficult.

Two deaths from cold, and many cases of collapse from exposure have been reported.

ALBANY, N. Y., Feb. 12—The train carrying the Tyrone Power and Theatrical Company with forty other passengers which was stalled in the snow on the New York Central road ten miles east of Oswego was released at noon today after being held thirty-six hours. Snowplows which were sent to the rescue of the imprisoned passengers forced a tunnel through the huge drifts. Later the roof of the tunnel was knocked in and the snow removed. Never before within the railroad history of this State have such conditions existed.

Two other passenger trains which had been stalled at Red Creek west of Oswego were shovelled out last night after having been detained for twenty-six hours.

COTTON MILLS STRIKE "FIXERS" GO TO WORK.

LAWRENCE, Mass., Feb. 12—That there will be some accessions to the ranks of the workers in the mills tomorrow morning is certain. Through the acting of the loom fixers, the members of that craft employed in Arlington Mills voted return to their work and the movement has been endorsed by the entire Loom Fixers union which is independent of both the industrial workers of the world and the American Federation of Labor. The sending to New York yesterday of more than one hundred children of the strikers was defended at a meeting held yesterday. James P. Thompson of Chicago, the General Organizer of the Industrial workers of the world declared that it was better for the children to leave their parents and go where they can get food, clothing and sunshine than remain here where he said they can have none of these essentials.
