NO MORE SEA-SICKNESS

The Belgian State Steamers' Anti-Rolling Device

Passengers crossing the Channel in the new Belgian State steamers enjoy the delights of a sea voyage without the miseries of sea-sickness. The new steamers, Stad Antwerpen and Ville de Liège, which the Belgian Government runs on the Dover-Ostend route, are the first among the vessels plying between Great Britain and the Continent to be provided with an anti-rolling arrangement. The arrangement, devised by Mr. Frahm, the engineer, consists of tanks fitted on both sides of the vessel as far as possible from her centre-line and communicating with each other. These tanks contain water, which is displaced under the influence of rolling. This water, which tends to flow to the lowest side, does not run at once from one side to the other, but "lags," so to speak. It will be understood, therefore, that there is always a greater bulk of water on the side of the vessel which is rising. Thus the effect of the weight of water contained in the tanks approximately balances at each moment the effect of the impact of the waves against the hull of the vessel, and thus prevents the rolling motion. The results obtained on several vessels are remarkable. Rolling motion, which used to make the vessel incline to either side at an angle of from 10 to 20 degrees, is commonly reduced to 2 or 3 degrees.

MILADY'S HAIR BRUSH

Not Only the Hair But the Brush Needs Good Care

Luxuriant, glossy hair is a great addition to one's good looks, so take great care of it. One way of keeping it in good health is to own a brush that fills your hair needs. Don't buy a brush just because the clerk wants you to. Examine its bristles thoroughly before you buy, remembering always that they must not be stiff and hard, but soft and moderately flexible, and that it will be an advantage to your hair if they are coarse and cut in different lengths. The size and shape of the brush is purely a question of taste, although one would not care for a brush with a heavy back and handle, as then hair brushing would cease to be a pleasure. It is of the utmost importance that the hair-brush should be kept immaculately clean. This is a task that a great many women neglect, as, apparently, they never stop to think that the bristles can grow dusty and grimy and altogether unfit for use on the hair.

There can be no set time for giving your hair-brush a cleaning bath, as some days the hair is dustier than others and consequently the brush grows grimy rapidly. I think it will suffice to say that it should be washed whenever it shows the slightest sign of soil.

Always, before cleaning your brush, comb out any hairs that may have become wound around the bristles. After this task is completed, dampen the bristles, then pour on a quantity of liquid green soap and rub the bristles briskly with your finger tips, occasionally dipping the brush in hot water.

When you have done this for several minutes and the bristles seem to have shed the grime fairly well, take a strong solution of washing soda, in very hot water and pour it into a large flat pan. See to it that the water comes not more than half way up the bristles of the brush, as otherwise the back and handle might be injured. When the bristles have been rubbed vigorously in this liquid for a minute, rinse them with lukewarm water and dry with a hot towel.

DEARER THAN GOLD

Many Metals Are Far More Costly—Some Are Peculiar

Gold is generally looked on as the last word in costliness; but, as a matter of fact, there are more metals dearer than gold than there are cheaper. The number of known metals is about seventy.

Iridium, for instance, of which a big find was made recently in Austria, is three times as expensive as gold. Gold is worth nearly \$30 an ounce. Iridium is worth some \$68, though the price will probably come down now.

Osmium is another metal much dearer than gold. It costs about \$50 an ounce. It is by far the heaviest of all known substances, being more than twenty-two times as heavy as water. This metal has the peculiar property of being able to stand without melting the most intense heat known.

Palladium about \$40 an ounce—is just the reverse. It is quite easy to make palladium vanish in steam. Being of a white, silvery color, and untarnishable, it is used for the division marks on scales and delicate scientific instruments.

UNCLE OF EUROPE

Prince Waldemar of Denmark, though still a comparatively young man, fifty-four years of age, is made to five rulers of Europe, the Kings of England, Denmark, Norway, Greece, and the Emperor of Russia.

Prince Waldemar, besides being an Admiral in the British navy, is interested in commercial ventures. He is a personal and intimate friend of several East Asiatic rulers, especially the King of Siam, and his friendship may to a great extent be credited to the success of the "East Asiatic Company" has achieved in East Asia. The Prince is the only surviving brother of Queen Alexandra, and after the death of his brother King George of Greece he inherited the title "The Uncle of Europe."
