Giants Increase League Lead By Three Full Games; Yanks Snap Losing Streak

GIANTS (A. P. By Guardian's Special Wire) NEW YORK, Aug. 19.—New York Giants took advantage of the Cardinals' illness today and increased their National League lead to three full games as they came from behind to whip Cincinnati Reds 4-3 in 10 innings at Polo Grounds.

Dick Bartell, who collected three hits during the afternoon, struck the deciding blow after the league leaders had knotted the count in the eighth with the bases full. Bartell beat out a hit to short while Ott scampered home with the winning run.

Although they were held to five hits and blanked for the first seven innings, the Chicago Cubs came through with a 2-1 decision over the Phillies in the second game of the series at Philadelphia to go into a virtual tie for second place with the St. Louis Cardinals. The victory left the Cubs with a record of 71 triumphs and 47 defeats as compared to 67 and 43 for the Cards.
