NATIVE BRITISH RACE.

England's Next Census it is Said May Reveal a Startling Shrinkage.

Population calculators predict that the decennial census of the United Kingdom which will be taken next year will reveal a startling shrinkage in the native British race. According to estimates issued by the register general, England, Scotland, Ireland and Wales will contain on April 1, 1901 a population of 41,297,000, compared with 33,104,000 in 1891, or a total increase of 3,193,000, which amounts only to 8.40 per cent., being 1.15 per cent. less increase than in the preceding decade, and 3.5 per cent. below the lowest ratio of increase recorded in any previous decade.

London expects to hold its own as the biggest city on earth. According to the expectation of the registry general it will return a population of four million five hundred thousand for the city proper, or a modest gain of three hundred thousand since 1896, when a municipal census was made. By including, however, the population of the whole of Greater London, which takes in a dozen suburban towns within a radius of about fifteen miles without any district demarcation, the total will probably reach six million and a half.

For the first time the census will exhibit the nationality of aliens living in the British Isles. There is keen speculation here as to how many Americans will be found to be living under the protecting folds of the Union Jack. When the last census was taken the American colony was so insignificant that it was not considered worthy of a place in the table of foreign residents. Now Uncle Sam's British sons and daughters run into the tens of thousands. Conservative estimates place their number at hardly less than 25,000, due jointly to their commercial invasion of the kingdom and the continuing popularity Anglo-American marriages.

RUSHED AT SYDNEY.

The Black Diamond Liner *Louisburg* sailed for Sydney Thursday, some hours after she was ready to leave. The cause of the delay was an order received from Sydney that the vessel should not proceed until instructed to do so. The rush at Sydney has been so great that it has been impossible to supply coal for the steamers already in port, and it was decided to hold the *Louisburg* here until such time as she could be attended to.

BIG COAL DEAL UNCONFIRMED.

TORONTO, January 5.—The sensational story from St. Paul to the effect that the Crow's Nest coal mines had been sold by the Canadian owners to J. J. Hill, president of the Great Northern railway, is not credited here, and no confirmation has been received as yet by any of those interested in the property. The alleged price, of \$5,000,000, it is said by those in a position to know, it is not nearly high enough to tempt the company to sell.

LONDON, January 4.—The children's album arrived at the colonial office to-day. It goes straight to Osborne Castle, the Queen having given directions to that effect. It is probable that it will afterwards be placed at some central place in London for public inspection.
