A LORDLY DESPOT AND HIS SATRAP.

Under our present circumstances in Prince Edward Island, in the winter season our every federal service is in the power of one man at Ottawa—the Honorable Louis Philippe Brodeur, Minister of Marine.

Now Monsieur Brodeur is by no means a cruel despot by nature. He has in his veins the blood of a sire who was a rebel, (or a patriot, which you please) who shouldered his musket and had a price set upon his head in the stormy days of 1837 in old Quebec.

In other words to one Captain Finlayson, by the special grace, certain knowledge and mere motion of His High Mightiness the Minister of Marine, is given during pleasure, power over all Island affairs for the winter season.

Captain Finlayson be it said, is not responsible for this condition of affairs. We doubt that he ever asked for the power with which he has been clothed, or that he feels much satisfaction in its exercise.

It is well that we shall fully understand the conditions of our present servitude. How it operates in actual working, has been already told and our people know to their cost.

THE BROKEN CABLE.

new factor which further tests the willingness of our masters to help us in the hour of need. As for them, have they not laid upon us heavy burdens and grievous to be borne?

The Examiner calls for all hands to "pull together" to make Mr. Borden the leader of a Government at Ottawa and so remedy our grievances.

The ambitious Mock Parliament has devised a scheme for the federation of the Empire. Next spring when the cables are restored, the news may be wired abroad to the astonished world.

10 to 20 per cent. will be a 1907 estimate for the advance that will have to be paid for cotton and wool goods this spring.

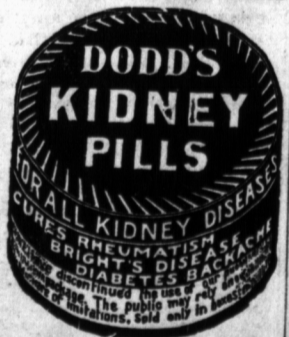
EDITOR'S MAIL
