A MURDERER'S CELL AT THE EDEN MUSEUM.
At the Eden Musee of New York City, one section of the underground labyrinth is called "The Chamber of Horrors." One of the historic features of this Chamber is a cell which has been maintained for over a quarter of a century, and in which wax representations of murderers have been placed. As soon as a noted criminal was condemned, his wax representation was placed in this cell. At the time of execution it was changed to the electric chair. As a matter of fact, this cell has nearly always been occupied. A few days ago, the wax figure of Rev. Charles V. Richeson was placed in the cell. The figure was made from drawings taken by the Musee's artist at the time of his plea of guilty in Boston. The young clergyman is shown seated at a table writing his confession. He presents the most pathetic figure of any criminal ever placed on exhibition at the Musee. The group of "People Talked About" has been rearranged and a number of new figures added. It now contains only persons prominent at this time in the public press. In the Winter Garden new moving pictures are shown hourly, afternoon and evening. An unusual interesting collection has just been received from the great moving picture centres, and visitors can see as many different pictures as they desire. The afternoon and evening concerts will have choice programs during the coming week.

HINDOOS IN CANADA STRONGLY CHAMPIONED.
OTTAWA, Jan. 19.—President Falconer, of Toronto University had an interview yesterday 1st, with Hon. Robert Rogers. He is representing the Toronto Association which champions the claims of the Hindoos in British Columbia. He urged that on the ground of common humanity the Indians should be allowed to bring their wives into the country. He also laid stress on the argument that Imperial interests are concerned and that their exclusion might cause trouble in India. Pres. Falconer also met H. H. Stevens, M. P. of Vancouver, who strongly opposed the relaxation of restrictions on oriental immigration. Mr. Stevens will probably deliver addresses on subject in Toronto.

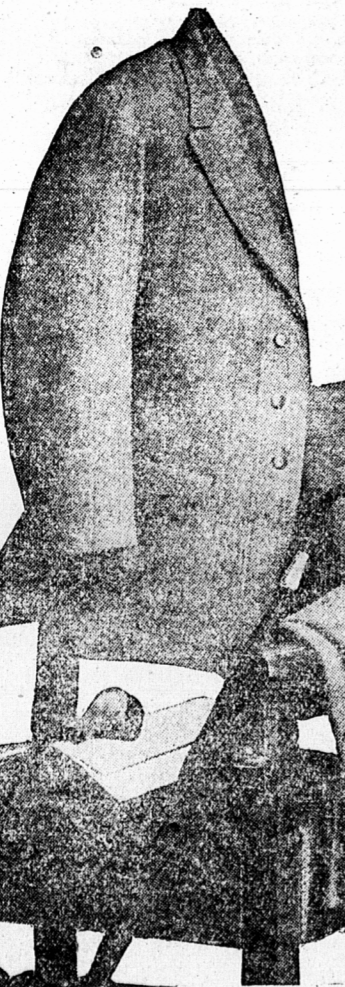
