#### SCHOOL INSPECTIONS.—The Superintendent of Education, Mr. R. Campbell, is making good progress in his annual inspection of the primary schools of the island. Last week he visited Kelly's Cross, Crapaud, Victoria, Tryon, Middleton and Kinross, and inspected all the schools in those districts. He was assisted in these inspections by Inspector Donlan. A Guardian representative yesterday asked Mr. Campbell "Did you find the same satisfactory conditions in these schools as you found in those you previously examined?" The Superintendent's reply was: "Yes, the work is fairly satisfactory, in some places, remarkably good." During the latter part of the week Mr. Campbell intends visiting Miscouche and Abramville and inspecting the schools there. In further conversation with the reporter, Mr. Campbell said that the snow of a fortnight ago had interrupted the work of the various schools in the country districts for one week, but attendance of that period dwindling considerably. But things had since regained their normal condition, and were now again satisfactory. The Superintendent further remarked: "There is more interest taken in the schools work now than has been the case for ever so long. The teachers are more optimistic. They are working better and with more hope in the future."
