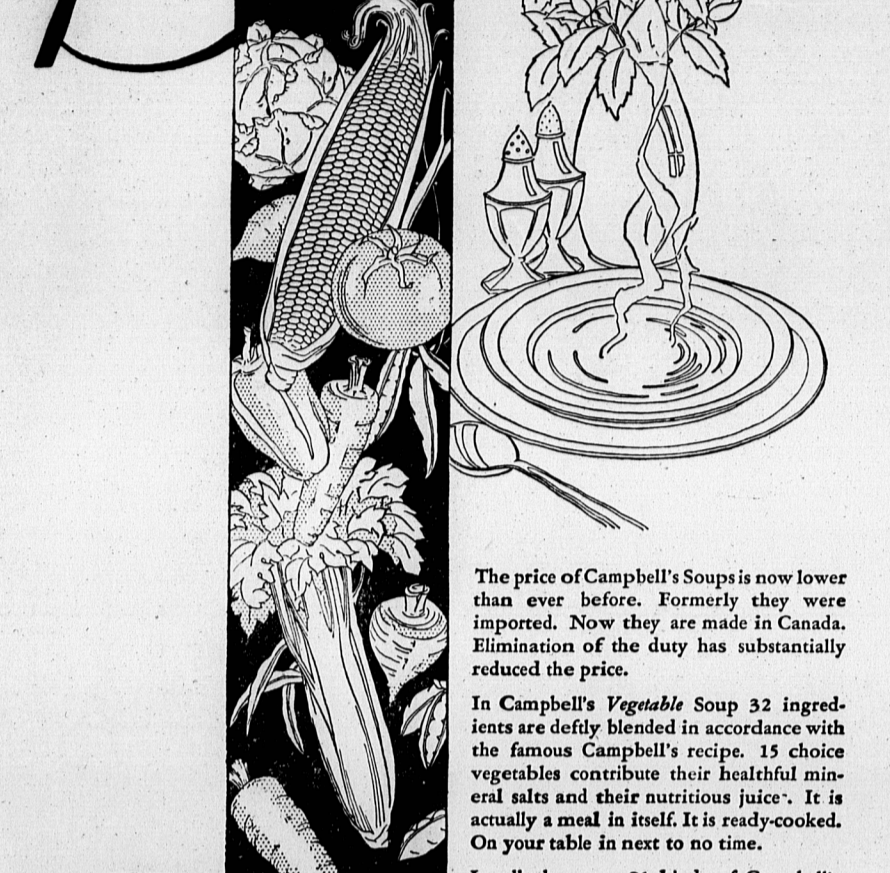

INVESTIGATING STOCK SALES

(Canadian Press)
 BOSTON, Mass., Oct. 22—Henry J. Fuller, a director of the Gillette Safety Razor Company, testified today at the hearing on a \$21,000,000 bill in equity brought by minority stockholders against certain directors, that sale of 60,000 shares of Gillette stock to the Gillette Company by the directors was rescinded as a result of demands made by minority stockholders, cross examination by Attorney William G. Thompson of the plaintiff's counsel, Fuller said he believed the question of a possible defense to the minority stockholders' suit was discussed at a directors' meeting on November 13, 1930.
 Asked if he were told that to approve the records of the August 11 meeting would be injurious to the defendant directors he first said "Yes," then he was not sure.
 Records of the Gillette Company directors meetings then were produced and Thompson called attention to two pages of the August 28 meeting which he said appeared to be numbered differently than the other pages.
 "Isn't it true that the records of August 28 meeting were changed and a few new sheets substituted for the original sheet?" he asked Fuller.
 "If so, I know nothing about it," Fuller answered.
 Thompson read part of the record of the stockholders meetings of January 8, 1930. Showing that Frank J. Fahey, another director, reported purchases of 8,835 shares of stock for \$750,359, and sale of 4,500 shares for \$458,707, the transactions resulting in a total profit to the company of \$73,407. Thompson asked Fuller if he protested against Fahey's activities on the stock market with funds of the company and Fuller said he had not.

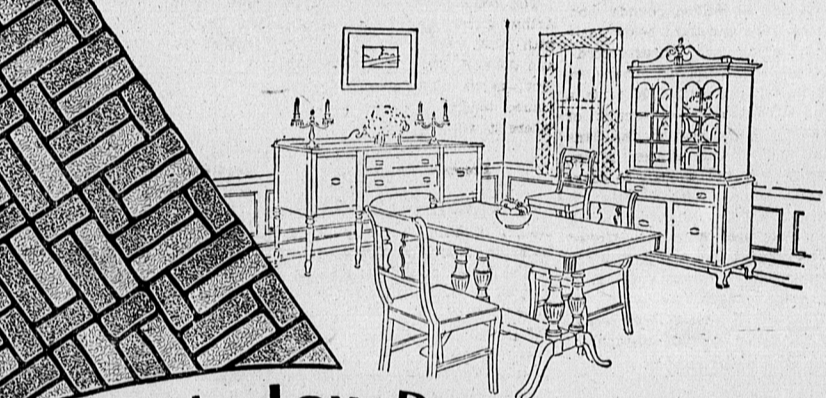

Negro Kills Two Then Suicides

 DURHAM, N. C., Oct. 22—Everett McLean, 28 years old negro, ran amuck in a fast-moving automobile near here yesterday, shot and killed B. H. Beasley, Southern Pines police chief, caused the accidental death of his sister, Georgia McLean, wounded his wife, Pearl McLean, and after being arrested, committed suicide by hanging himself in the Durham country jail.
 Chief Beasley had accompanied the McLean party to Boynton, Va., seeking to have charges of attempted murder against the negro dismissed. In this they failed and McLean still faced the charge that he had thrown his wife into the Roanoke river near Boynton several months ago.
 It was on the return trip to Southern Pines that Beasley was killed, and the automobile wrecked.
