Held In Georgetown On Monday and Tuesday.

Practical And Eloquent Addresses Given By The Different Speakers—Next Meeting In Springfield.

The forty-fourth session of the P. E. Island Quarterly Conference was held with the Baptist Church at Georgetown on Dec. 7th and 8th, Rev. J. C. Spurr in the chair.

Rev. A. F. Browne, of North River, preached an earnest and thoughtful sermon from Heb. 12:—'The Author and Finisher of our Faith'. An evangelistic service was conducted by Rev. Josiah Webb, of Alberton and Springfield.

Tuesday morning. Session opened with a prayer service led by Brother N. J. McDonald. The reports from the churches were of a very pleasing nature. Two new church edifices were dedicated on Sunday, the 6th inst. at Georgetown and East Point. Revs. J. C. Spurr, J. W. Gardner, and F. D. Davidson reported additional ones.

Brother F. J. Linklater, Lidentate, who has been conducting evangelistic services at Appin Road, Lot 30, was invited to a seat. He also received a letter recommending him to the Baptist churches of P. E. Island as a licensed preacher.

The afternoon session opened with a prayer service led by Rev. J. W. Gardner. After the business of the Conference in regard to reports, Appointment of committees etc., Rev. G. P. Raymond gave a very interesting and instructive address entitled: 'The Relation of the Baptist Sunday Schools on the Island to the International S. S. Association.'

The evening session was devoted largely to the work of Home and Foreign Missions. The speakers were Rev. D. W. Crandall and Rev. Josiah Webb.

Brother A. W. Stiers, of Charlottetown, gave an address on 'Denominational Finance.' This address was full of good, practical suggestions and will doubtless be a help to the pastors and delegates.

Conference adjourned to meet in March 1904 at Springfield, Prince Co.
