Again storing the mind with facts is not education and the percentage system of testing the teacher's work is satisfied by the mere repetition of facts. As a consequence the most important of educational work, the training of the intellect, cultivating the imagination, developing the reason, is to a certain extent neglected.

One may judge of the worth of a book by the dinner produced; of the artisan by the article made; of the salesman by the sales to his credit; but of the teacher by the number of facts his pupils can recite, never. How then? By a careful examination of the condition physical and mental of the pupils, with some knowledge of their surroundings out of school, and then by a test of their power to do things, and also by judging the teacher as he is seen to his work.

What has all this to do with home lessons? Simply this. What is required of the teacher, the test to which he is submitted, will very largely determine the nature and extent of the home work required of the pupils. The test to which teachers are submitted and the course of study they have to undertake is a very large determining factor in the system of education that obtains in any community. To avoid excessive home study let there be a system of inspection that will show the teacher's ability to teach rather than the pupils' power to cram.
