Fast or Dangerous Driving.

SIR.—The time has gone by to talk in euphemistic terms to the drivers of fast horses or to those who persist in driving where accident is probable. The lash of the law is held in leash but it is a law that punishes any driver or the owner who ignores the fact that the pedestrian has right of way and that not one case in a thousand is on record where team owners have been released from penalties on the score of "contributory negligence" by the person killed or hurt.

During the procession yesterday a barouche drawn by two horses was driven at a smart trot down Grafton Street just as the procession reached the Kindergarten. The driver recklessly kept on skirting the band, knocking down a small boy who was taken literally from the horse's legs by one of the Band. I should have said snatched not taken as the horses were still in motion.

When spoken to the driver replied most insolently that he couldn't stop his horses. For fifty yards along Grafton Street the crowd awaiting the Band must have been in full view, then the sound of the music must have been evident yet he persisted. A recent transgressor in this particular who had run down and hurt a man was not prosecuted, hence all drivers who lack manhood fancy they may endanger children's lives or limbs.

Any man who possessed a grain of consideration would reason that the Band gave pleasure to a great number and that while another street was open to him that street would take or wait till the procession passed.

Again at the Park a sulky with rubber tires went by the Band and just avoided striking an instrument by a fraction of an inch.

Until the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals and Children becomes alive we may expect these accidents and the lords of the way to laugh in their sleeve, for private prosecutions are not desirable.
