Skipper Tells Of Fighting In France

YARMOUTH, N. S., June 27.—(CP)—The skipper of a European freighter told today of unloading his cargo of coke from a river at Royan, France, while French troops fought Germans on both banks nearby.

He told, too, of the morning of May 11, when Hitler invaded the lowlands. Heavy artillery fire and bombing started the crew from their beds at four a.m. while the freighter lay at anchor off Flushing, Belgium. When the day dawned, scores of bombers were seen, dropping over the country in their missions of death. Anti-aircraft fire forced them to fly at great height, the captain said. Pitcher Drops Dead On Mound
