The council of the N. B. Although the last game in the Rugby Football League was played last Saturday there is still considerable interest being manifested in the game. The season of 1911 was the most successful Rugby season for a number of years, and the interest taken was largely due to the presence of the Cornwall team. When it was announced some time ago that the fourth Cruiser Squadron would visit Halifax, followers of football began to make inquiries as to whether the ships could raise a football fifteen. Yesterday afternoon R. A. Corbett, Vice-President of the Wanderers sent a wireless message to the squadron asking for a game for Saturday. The Wanderers had planned to visit Charlottetown this week, but as the trip would take three days it was found impossible to get together anything like a lineup. The St. John teams have also been negotiating with the Wanderers for a game to be played this week but the final arrangements have not yet been made. Should the St. John trip materialize the game with the Navy, provided they have a team, will likely be played next Wednesday.—Halifax Exc.

The death occurred at the P.E. Island Hospital Saturday morning at eight o'clock of Evelyn E. only daughter of John H. and Mrs. Weeks, Fredericton, aged 7 months. The little one was taken suddenly ill Friday morning and was brought to this city on the express that night and taken to the hospital. There four physicians undertook to perform a critical operation in the hope of saving the child's life. The body was taken to Fredericton on the afternoon train Saturday. The bereaved parents will have the sympathy of their many friends in their sorrow.

W. E. W. Jackson of the Meteorological Observatory believes that the use of the proposed Hudson Bay route to Europe for the transportation of Western wheat is beset with serious obstacles. During the summer Mr. Jackson was sent to Hudson Bay Straits by the Dominion Government to conduct a magnetic survey of the Straits, determining the variations of the compass for the purpose of compiling a chart in connection with the proposed trade route to England. He was unable to carry out his object owing to the juxtaposition of two deterrent factors, a leaky ship and ice floes. The craft which the Government provided Mr. Jackson with was the unfortunate schooner "Burligh," which made such an adventurous voyage, and was brought back to Halifax only by skilful seamanship and constant toiling at the pumps. Before she left Belle Isle the schooner developed a leak, which was not regarded as serious. The long journey northwards, however, in tow of the Government steamer Minto, strained her, and the leak became more noticeable. When in Hudson Strait the steamer cast her off, and proceeded into Hudson Bay to perform hydrographic work. Mr. Jackson does not state that ships cannot make the journey, but holds that they cannot compete with the Montreal route from the point of view of cost. For one thing, the ice in the Straits necessitates ships of specially reinforced construction and consequently smaller, carrying capacity and very powerful engines. These would probably be able to steam at the utmost ten knots which would not admit of their making more than two return trips a season. Again for the rest of the year they would be next to useless, as their construction and expense in manipulating would render them unable to compete with the ordinary class of freighters. Thus if the boats were to be run at a profit, the freight charges, would have to be considerably higher than usual and render the cost of transport prohibitive.—Exc.

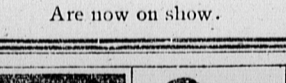
