FINANCIAL NEWS BRIEFS

MONTREAL, July 28—Power Corporation—June power production of six companies in power group up 15.65 per cent over June 1936.

North American Co.—Net earnings for 12 months ended June equal to \$2.01 a share up from \$2.52 in previous year.

Canadian Nickel and Copper—For 12 months to end of May nickel production at 90.4 million pounds up 31.6 per cent and Copper 201 million pounds up 15.4 per cent over corresponding 1936 period.

TORONTO, July 28—McVittie Graham—Holding controlling interest in the Shaver McGarry property. Larder Lake, adjoining the Chesterville has completed 5 Diamond drill holes. As yet the drilling has given nothing definite and it is the likely intention of the Con-Ed management to complete close to 10,000 feet of drilling before determining the extent of possibilities and the future undertaking. The structure has been encouraging.

B. and B. Royalties—It is understood this well is being acidized through the large royalty holders which would start to benefit from an improvement in flow are Gaimont 15 per cent, Vulcan 10 per cent, A. P. C. 8 per cent and United, Commonwealth and MacDougal Segur.

Canadian Industrial Alcohol—It is expected that any consideration of a cash dividend during the end of the fiscal year September 30. Substantial better results in the current year have led to expectation of a distribution but of course, this is a matter that directors must decide upon next fall when figures for the full year are available for them. Cash position is being steadily built up as a result of the liquidation of the company's American Inventory Stocks.

Livestock

(By The Canadian Press) MONTREAL, July 28—Hog prices increased to \$12.75 rail grade, \$9.90 weighed off cars and \$9.50 off trucks. Sows were unchanged at \$8.95 grade and \$6.65 off trucks. Other kinds of livestock held steady. Steers sold up to \$7.50 and butchers cows up to \$4. Cutters made \$2 to \$2.75 and canners from \$2 down. Bulls went at \$4. Good lambs went at \$8.25 while calf prices were not quoted.

Produce Prices

(By The Canadian Press) MONTREAL, July 28—Butter tended to ease on Montreal open produce markets today while potatoes also went lower and eggs held firm. Graded egg shipments in carlots or less were quoted nominally at 32 cents a dozen for grade A-2 for B-3 for A-medium, 23 1-2 for B-large and 21 for C. Whites made \$2 to \$2.75 and canners from \$2 down. Bulls went at \$4. Good lambs went at \$8.25 while calf prices were not quoted.

Grain

(By The Associated Press) CHICAGO, July 28—With considerable buying based on war developments in the far east, wheat prices late today scored a maximum upturn of 4 1-4 cents a bushel. A majority of wheat handlers, however, indicated that there had been relatively little new export business in North American wheat today, for the time being. Europeans apparently refused to follow price upturns, and bulges in values applied chiefly to July contracts in which speculative dealings ended today. Wheat closed unchanged to 4 1-4 cents higher, July 1-24 to 1.26 3-4, Sep. 1-18 3-8 to 1-2, Dec. 1-20 1-8 to 3-8, corn 2 3-8 off to 1-4 up, Sep. 1-2 to 5-8, Dec. 72, and oats at 3-8 down to 1-8 advance.

Mining

(Canadian Press) TORONTO, July 28—In good condition. Tobacco plants are showing good growth. Wild and cultivated berries are plentiful and apples and other fruits are developing satisfactorily. St. Lawrence and Lake Saint John District — All crops look promising and are making satisfactory progress under favourable weather conditions. Haying has commenced and a good average yield is looked for. Pasture is excellent. Potatoes and other root crops are promising. Berries and small fruits are plentiful.

Province of Ontario

Rains in northern sections have improved prospects there and pastures have been benefited. Excessive rainfall in southwestern counties has caused some damage on low lands. A good average yield of fall wheat is expected. Oats and barley are promising but some lodging has occurred. Root crops, corn and beans are making favourable progress. Storing of a heavy yield of fair quality hay is about completed. Pasture remains in excellent condition. Peaches and early apples are promising. Burley and black varieties of tobacco in Kent and Essex counties are showing adverse effects from excessive moisture. The present condition of the cured tobacco in Norfolk, Elgin, Oxford and Brant counties indicates a normal yield of good quality leaf and an early harvest.

Maritime Provinces

Grains are making good progress. Potatoes the most part are promising; other root crops are in good condition. Rains in a few localities are retarding the harvesting of a bountiful hay crop. Pastures are good. A heavy apple crop is expected. Wild and cultivated berries are plentiful and prospects for other fruits are satisfactory.

Province of British Columbia

Grains are making good progress. Haying is well advanced and the cut is heavy and of good quality. Raspberries are more plentiful than last year. Roots and vegetables are progressing satisfactorily. Early potatoes are moving to market in quantity. Field tomatoes are ripening fast and a large crop is expected. Hops are a heavy crop. Tree fruits are showing well and the following yields are now indicated: Apples and peaches 95% of average, pears 90%, plums 85%, plums and prunes fair to good. Water for irrigation is plentiful.
