opponents would make if either was void of clubs. In short, North decided that it was wiser to pay out a few hundred points by sacrificing at seven clubs, than to gamble that conditions were favorable to the defeat of six spades.

It is obvious enough that North guessed wrong in this particular instance, since six spades could have been beaten, and so could seven clubs. He was entirely right however, in the broader sense, since the two missing clubs might easily have been in one defender's hand. And he was even "right" in the light of the outcome of his "sacrifice!"
