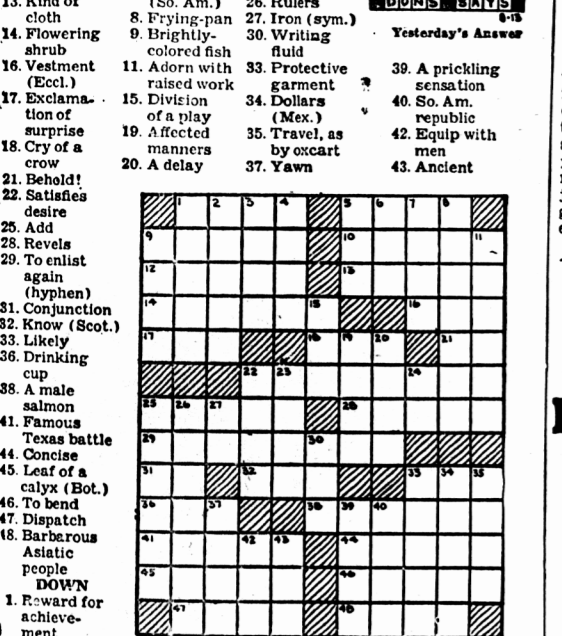

### Instead Of Dying He Finds Hamlet

VELLARDVILLE, Sask., Aug. 12 (CP)—Just after the First World War, a doctor, Louis Vellaro, he had a year to live. That doctor probably would be a bit embarrassed today, for Louis Vellaro—still alive and healthy—has founded a thriving village which bears his name.

Although Vellaroville is little more than an outpost hamlet in northeast Saskatchewan, this year it will ship out more than 15,000 cords of pulpwood—valued at \$12 a cord.

He first visited this area in 1908 after working six miles from the railroad to work in a lumber camp. He was called back to France in 1911 for army service and during the war, won the French Military Medal and the Croix de Guerre with two bars. It was after he was gassed at Verdun that doctors told him he would die within a year. He then decided to return to his quarter-section homestead here.

Vellaroville was just a nameless siding when he returned, but soon there were three families in the district and the railroad agreed to make it a request stop. There were many other things missing when he returned—but gradually he added stock, equipment and land. Today, his wife is postmaster, and sometimes rides her bicycle five miles into the bush to deliver a telegram. Now the siding is listed on the railroad timetable, and its inhabitants expect it will be a regular stop soon.

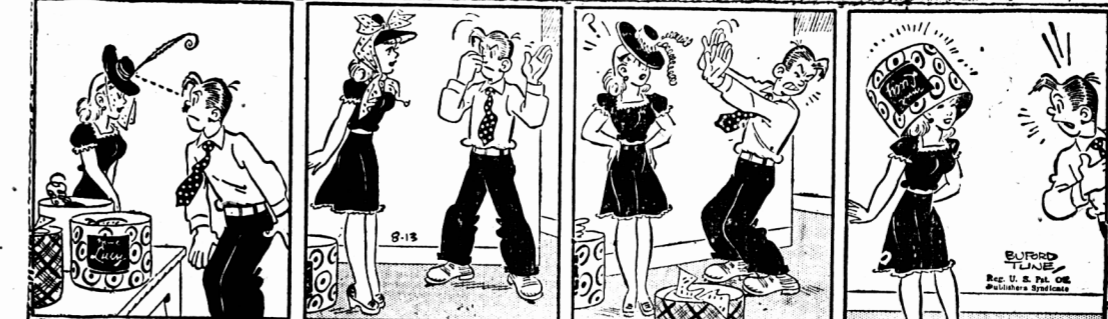

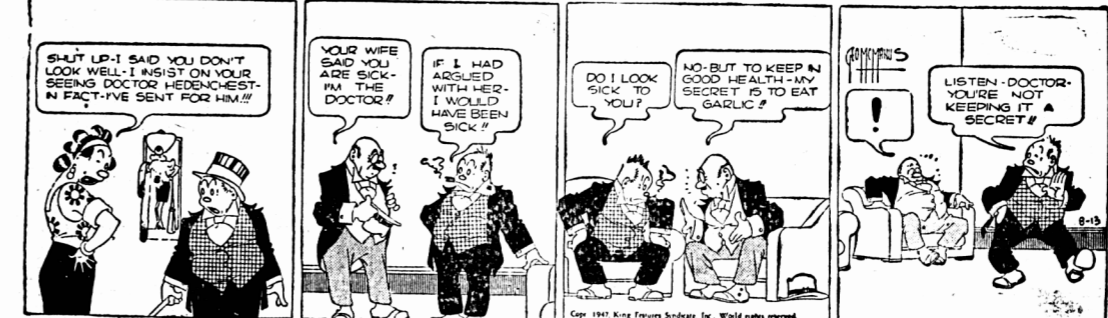

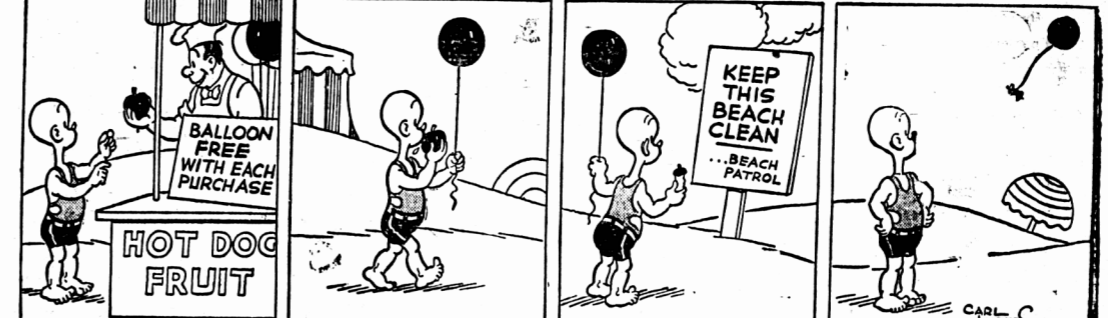
