MORE DISCIPLINE IN MAINE PRISON

THOMASTON, Maine, April 10.—Inmates of the state prison here are beginning to feel the iron rod of authority. From now on not more than four hundred love letters weekly will find their way out from behind the institution's stone walls. Limitation of correspondence to two letters a week was the most vigorously protested rule of the new order established by Warden C. E. Linscott a short time ago. Early one morning the prisoners decided to "yammer" which is technical terminology for a noise riot. Six hours of yammering resulted only in six of their number going to solitary, and the new rules, which include compulsory wearing of prison uniforms are still in force.
