 THANKSGIVING DAY.

Tomorrow is the day set apart for thanksgiving to Almighty God for the blessings and mercies which have fallen to the lot of the people of Canada during the year. It becomes us at this time as a Christian nation to consider how great and manifold have been the evidences of divine goodness, and to show that our gratitude shall bear some proportion to the great obligation of thankfulness under which we have been placed. A very little reflection must satisfy any one that to the people of Canada the lines have been cast in pleasant places and they have a goodly heritage.

Ours is a vast and lordly land, dowered richly with the treasures of the soil, the mine, the forest and the sea. Its splendid water ways, its outlook upon two oceans, its abundant harbors, give unexampled facilities for trade and commerce. It is a land well watered and fertile, a land of flocks and herds, of food in abundance, a land of healthful climate and exempt from earthquakes, tornadoes and from many of the worst diseases which are the scourge of less favored countries. And yet we are prone to forget that in the Providential ordering of the world's affairs this noble heritage was given to our fathers and to their children and children's children's truly and by the same great Giver of all good as the land of Canaan was given to the Hebrew people.

If for the richness of our material heritage we have cause for gratitude, that is but the beginning of our manifold blessings. The same Providence that made it rich and made it ours has with the land given us the untold blessings of civil and religious liberty in fullest measure. Here from generation to generation every man of whatever creed has been free to worship under his own vine and fig tree, none daring to make him afraid. Here under just and equal laws we enjoy an unexampled security of life and property. Here our rulers are men of our own choice, our laws are made by ourselves, administered by just judges, and even our taxes are of our own ordering.

And with all these exalted possessions and priceless privileges we have enjoyed from generation to generation past the crowning blessing of peace. For more than four score years no foreign foe has seriously threatened this fair domain. Not even the oldest of our grey haired grandfathers can remember the sight of an invading army on Canadian soil. In that long period, during which the people of Canada have been free from war's alarms and left to enjoy the peaceful pursuits of industry, how many lands less favored have been devoted to slaughter and pillage. In fact there is no country, civilized or savage except our own Mother Land, that has not within that period been called to combat for the lives and homes of its people. How great

has been this blessing of a peace, so prolonged and so secure!

As a part of the great British Empire which includes within its bounds nearly one fourth of the world's area and nearly one fourth of the world's people, we have cause for devout thankfulness to the God of Nations. For that the Empire is so strong by sea and land, for the freedom, the tolerance, that prevail beneath her flag, for the beneficence of her rule extending to the ends of the earth, for the good Queen who ruled so long and the good King who peacefully succeeded to the crown, we as subjects of the Empire have great cause for profoundest gratitude. And yet we need sometimes to be reminded of these things, "lest we forget."

If we return to thoughts of our own Canadian home and the narrower compass of the passing year we must feel that our reasons for gratitude are many and various. The fields, the herds and flocks have yielded an abundant increase. The sea, the lakes and rivers, have paid us plentiful tribute. Never before have the mines of Canada proved so productive of gold and coal. Our manufacturing have been busy and prosperous. Labor has been well remunerated. Trade has prospered beyond all precedent. The national treasury has overflowed with revenue. And no scourge of war, or famine, pestilence or earthquake, or other great disaster has befallen our happy Dominion. No land in all the world, no Christian community in any age has been more favored than has Canada in the year and in the generation now passing.

It behooves us therefore as a people believing in God as the loving Father of men and Who has provided for us the blessings here recited, and countless other blessings which each ought to recall for himself, to honor and observe the day set apart for thanksgiving and offer up our heartfelt gratitude to Him from whom all blessings flow.
