BORDER BOOTLEGGING SERIOUSLY HAMPERED BY WORK OF R. C. M. P.

ST. ALBAN'S Vt., Nov. 1 - Close cooperation between the United States Customs service and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police already is hampering activities of the border run-runner, Harry C. Whitehill, Collector of Customs for the Vermont district, made known tonight.

Today, the collector said, the border patrol intercepted three automobiles from Providence, R. I., equipped for rum-running, and returning from Canada without a cargo. The drivers explained that while in the Dominion they were watched so closely by the "mounties" that they were afraid to ship a load of liquor. After waiting in Canada several days, they said they "gave it up as a bad job."

They Royal Canadian Mounted Police, acting on instructions from the Minister of Customs at Ottawa, recently undertook to aid in stopping the flow of liquor across the border. The officers, it is said, have orders to seize any American automobiles which they "have reason to believe" are engaged in rum-running.

Doubts Religious Radio

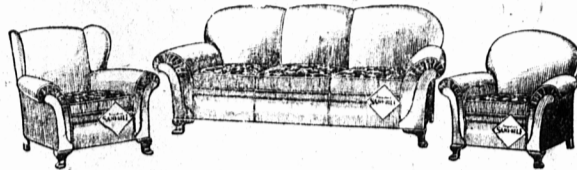

Marrying Chief Joy Of Methodist Dean

MALDEN, Mass., Oct. 29. - The dean of Methodist ministers is still performing marriage ceremonies at the age of 102. Whenever a young couple comes to the home here of The Rev Edward Stuart Best for marriage, the aged pastor readily consents. In fact, it is today one of his chief joys. Some Are Grandchildren Rev. Mr. Best receives visits from couples, many grown old, whom he married in their youth. He has been a preacher in the New England conference for half a century. "They bring their children and sometimes their grandchildren with them," he said, "and their coming delights my heart." His garden has been a favorite occupation of late but the minister also enjoys reading and writing verse. Radio is a source of speculative religious interest. Doubts Religious Radio

he brings to his congregation. I do not think that this spirit can be transmitted over the radio." The venerable clergyman thinks that women will eventually organize their forces and drive tobacco from the nation. "I hope the time will never come," he declared, "when ministers are paid large salaries. A minister should receive enough to live comfortably and that's all." Mr. Best was born in Newry, Ireland, Sept. 3, 1824. He had served 21 churches in the conference when he retired from active ministry in 1901.

IN MEMORIAM WILLIAM McPHERSON On Wednesday, September 8th, Mr. William McPherson a very highly esteemed resident of Bradalbane passed peacefully away at the age of 75 years. The deceased had not been in a very good condition of health for some months but his loved ones had not thought that his case was at all serious. About two weeks before his death he underwent a thorough examination when it was learned that he could not possibly regain his health. From this time on he began to sink quite rapidly until on the above mentioned date his spirit winged its homeward flight. Mr. McPherson leaves a sorrowing widow to mourn her loss. He was one member of a family of three brothers and three sisters. The brothers were William of Bradalbane, Malcolm of Glen Valley, and Alexander of Dundas and the sisters were Mrs. Donald McLeod, Inkerman, Bradalbane, and Mrs. Alex. Corbett, Granville. Of these only two now survive the deceased namely one brother Malcolm, and one sister Mrs. Donald McLeod. One sister Mrs. Murdoch Graham passed away recently some three weeks after her brother. Mr. McPherson was a man who was quite widely and favorably known. The greater part of his life was spent in Glen Valley where he proved himself to be a successful farmer. Since having sold his farm he has lived quietly at Bradalbane.
