FEDERAL HOUSE TO SPEED - UP PROGRAM

SET APRIL 10 AS GOAL FOR PROROGATION

Provincial Legislatures Also Put On Drive To Conclude Sessions In Time For Coronation.

Canada's order paper should be cleared by May day. As the Dominion Parliament and provincial legislatures hurry their law-making to free members for the coronation, it appears the last royal assent will be given a fortnight or so before the May 12 ceremony.

OTTAWA, March 28—The back of the parliamentary session should be broken this week. Most items to engage the attention of House of Commons members have already been discussed in one form or another and progress should be rapid.

NEW YORK, March 28—Germany possessed a definite lead today in the international battle for supremacy on the air trade routes of the North Atlantic.

Her zeppelin Hindenburg will start flying passengers, mail and freight May 5 from Frankfurt to New York for the second successive summer without competition.

Eden, speaking with the authority of the Baldwin Government, has definitely stated Britain does not intend to be drawn into any wars between the rival ideologies of Fascism and Communism.
