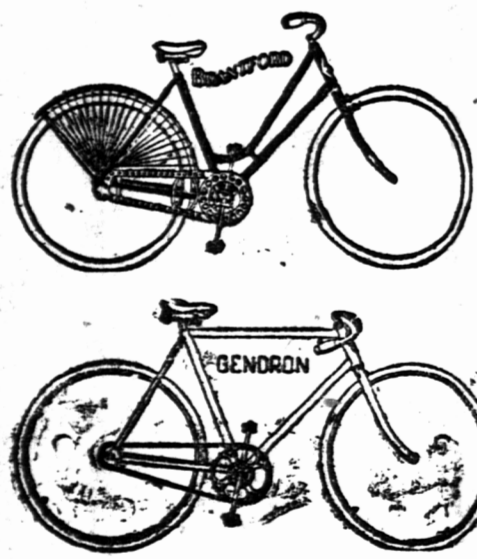

At The Police Court.

On Saturday morning H. C. Conolly charged with violation of the Prohibition Act appeared before the police court. Four witnesses were examined, viz. Wm. Austin, Joseph Kirby, Robert Wakeling, Walter McGregor. Robert Wakeling testified to the purchase of a flask of brandy from Conolly on 8th June, and paying for it. Joseph Kirby testified to getting beer between the 5th and 12th, and if he drank enough of it, he believed it really would intoxicate.

Mr. Campbell for the prosecution, said he did not wish to call any more witnesses as he considered the testimony submitted was sufficient for a conviction.

Mr. Stewart, counsel for defence intimated that as this was the first case in which any evidence of a sale had been made, he wished for an adjournment to consult with his client and perhaps he would bring in rebuttal evidence. If a conviction followed a first case would be made in Supreme Court.

The Stipendiary intimated that whenever the evidence was sufficient he would convict. He could not see that by the postponement of the case rebuttal evidence could be brought in. The testimony in the case was very clear and distinct, and he would therefore impose a fine of \$100.

The second case against Conolly in which he was charged with making a sale on the 12th and 23rd of June was adjourned until Saturday, after hearing the testimony of Patrick Quinn.

Three subpoenas issued in the second case were not served. Constable Henderson testified that on different occasions he had attempted to serve the papers but was unable to do so.

The first case since the Act came in force against Capt Hughes, adjourned for four times, was dismissed. A witness, Artrmas Lord, sailor served with a subpoena failed to appear. After Henderson had testified to serving the document upon Lord, the Magistrate intimated that the would be punished.

Three drunks appeared viz: Andrew Corish, Henry Palmer and Patrick Prunty. The two former were fined \$4 or 10 days each, and the latter \$2 or 8 days.

Samuel Donovan appeared in answer to a warrant issued on complaint of Edward Murphy charging him with assault. The accused was admitted to bail.

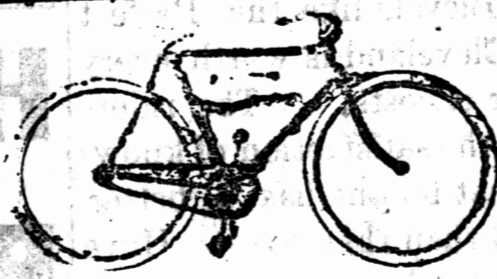

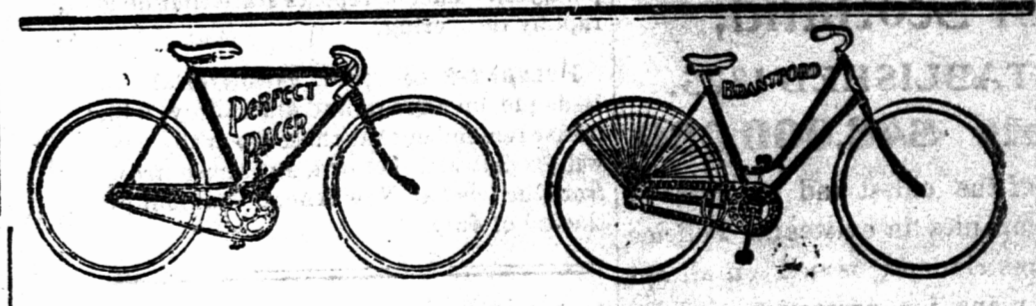

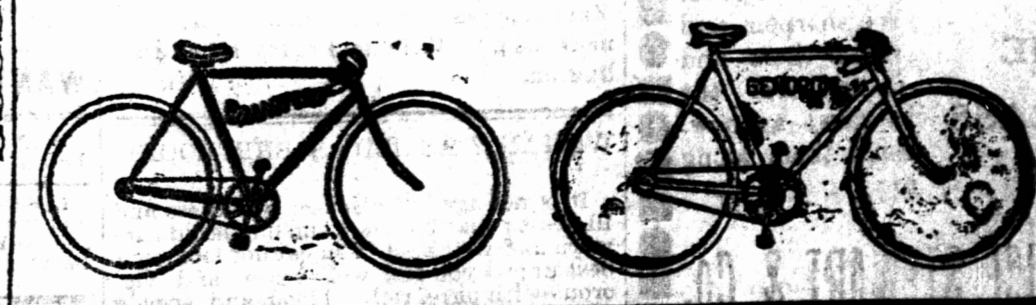
