Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

The sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency not Sub-Agency on certain conditions. Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$5.00 per acre. Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after entering homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may make a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$5.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$500. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

shrapnel shell, Campbell was wounded in the hip, and Marshall got his face and arms terribly lacerated. A piece of the shell went into Sergeant Nicholson's back, and came out through his shoulder. "It was a very lucky wound," writes Sergeant Nicholson, because if it had gone through in any other way the results would have been far more serious. He was separated from the other two men at the second dressing station, and has not seen them since. They classify the cases on the way down. They were classed as stretcher cases, and he is a sitting case.

Sergeant Nicholson then describes the meeting with his sister as follows: "A peculiar thing happened, which I will relate. On our part of the line there is no other battery of Canadians, so on the way down I was the only Canadian on a hospital train of 800 wounded. We did not know what hospital we were bound for, some said Le Havre, some Rouen, and others that we would go straight to England. I'm-gine my surprise, when I learned an hour before arriving that Etaples was our destination. At that hospital Elsie (his sister) came up to see me that night, and while there they treated me very kindly.

Sergeant Nicholson said that he was in a military hospital with about 2,000 patients, and it is a busy place. The business of that hospital is to get the men fit for the front as soon as possible. In describing his wounds he said that there was a channel from one of his wounds to the other, and in order to keep it clean the Sergeant made an incision joining the wounds, which is by no means a pleasant operation.

Sergeant Nicholson gives a graphic and interesting account of the big drive and says that the losses were heavy. He says that no one who is not on the field can form an accurate idea of the situation. The Germans are very crafty, but the English did not seem to know what fear is. In hand to hand fighting they always get the better of the Germans, and it is hard to get at them. He believes that six months at least will see the Huns beaten. He says that he will be in the fighting again as soon after as he gets fit. His wound bothers him quite a little, but he was glad to get in a bed and rest. There is no rest in France for those who do the fighting, and take risks. At no time is a man safe, and even when he does lie down the bombardment is going on continually, and he is liable to be called out at any minute.
