The Markets

MONTREAL, Que., Oct. 19.—The foreign demand for grain here today was quiet and of a moderate amount of business was accomplished. There was an improved demand for ocean grain room here and all the continental freight was removed from the market with the exception of heavy grain to Rotterdam at eleven cents per hundred pounds. The inquiry from New York exporters for No. 1 and No. 2 northern wheat here was good, but as the offerings were practically all no business resulted. There was a fair demand from local exporters for No. 3 northern and a moderate trade was done at 4 1/2c to 5c per bushel over the Winnipeg October option, c. l. l. Montreal, and sales of some fair sized lots of No. 1 Canadian Western barley were made to New York at ten cents per bushel over the Winnipeg October option, and tough No. 4 grade at 9 1/2c per bushel over the same option, c. l. l. Montreal. There was no further change in the domestic market for coarse grains, prices being with a limited demand. Prices for all grades of spring and winter wheat flour were well maintained under a moderate inquiry. The trade in most lines of mill feed continued fairly active and the undertone was firm. There was a fair demand for standard grades of rolled oats and values were unchanged. A fair amount of business was done in eggs and prices were firm. The receipts were 2,127 cases. The undertone to the market for potatoes was steady with a fair trade passing. Sales of car lots of New Brunswick Green Mountains were made at \$3.35 per bag, Cobblers at \$1.30, and Quebec white stock at \$1.25 to \$1.35 per bag of ninety pounds, ex-truck. The butter market was without any new feature to note, the demand being still of a very limited character and prices were unchanged. The receipts were 491 packages. Owing to the indifferent demand from English importers for cheese and the fact that there was also a lull in the buying power for United States account, trading in cheese was extremely quiet today and the undertone was easier. Western grades were offered at 29c per pound, and eastern qualities at 19 3/4c per pound. The receipts were 3,783 boxes.
