Department of Labour

Week ending January 31st, 1920 Reports from employers to the Dominion Headquarters of the Employment Service of Canada, Department of Labour, indicate that there was, as had been anticipated, an increase in the volume of employment afforded by those same firms for the week ending January 17th, which week will hereafter be used as a base week for comparative purposes.

The actual increase for the week ending January 31st was not as large as had been anticipated. Increases were registered in all districts except the Maritimes and British Columbia, the increase in Quebec again being the most considerable. Ontario, Quebec, and British Columbia anticipated increases on February 7th. The Maritime Provinces and the prairies provinces on the other hand anticipated increase being in fact considerably larger than the actual gain during the week of January 31st.

Six groups registered decreases during the week of January 31st and ten groups recorded increases. The groups registering decreases were Building and Construction; Lumbering; Food, Drink and Tobacco; Leather and Leather Goods; Textiles and Railway Operation. These that reported increases were Commercial and Mercantile; Clay Glass and Stone Products; Chemicals; Metals; Pulp Paper and Printing; Vehicles; Woodworking; Quarrying and Mining; Railway Construction; and Miscellaneous.

In comparison with the figures for January 17th the following groups showed declines, Building and Construction; Commercial and Mercantile; Lumbering; Food, Drink and Tobacco. All other groups registered increases, the gains in Vehicles and Metals being especially noteworthy. For the week ending February 7th, slight decreases were anticipated in Building and Construction; Commercial and Mercantile; Chemicals; Food, Drink and Tobacco; and Quarrying and Mining. All other groups anticipated having increases.

Reports for the week ending January 31st were received from 4291 firms. These firms reported 664,957 persons on their payrolls as compared with 664,207 for the week ending January 24th, and with 660,963 persons on payroll for the week ending January 17th. An increase of 750 persons or one-tenth of one percent, therefore, was reported during the week of January 31st as compared with the preceding week. Moreover these same firms anticipated increasing their staff by 1427 persons or two tenths of one percent during the week ending February 7th. The increase for the week of January 31st had been anticipated since the reports for the week ending January 24th indicated that the increase of 810 persons or one tenth of one percent was expected for the week of the 31st. The returns would indicate that the actual increase was slightly smaller than that anticipated.

When the returns are compared with the base figures an increase of 3994 persons or six tenths of one percent is indicated. Plus Industries.—Those that registered net increases in the number of persons employed—for the week ending January 31st as compared with January 24th, with their respective increases were as follows: Building and Mercantile, one-tenth of one percent; Clay, Glass and Stone Products nine-tenths of one percent; Chemicals six-tenths of one percent; Metals, five-tenths of one percent; Pulp Paper and Printing three-tenths of one percent; Vehicles one and three-tenths of one percent; Woodworking five-tenths of one percent; Quarrying and Mining six-tenths of one percent; Railway Construction one and seven-tenths percent; Miscellaneous seven-tenths of one percent.

The increase in vehicles of 909 persons was the largest actual addition recorded. All these groups, with the exception of Commercial and Mercantile, Chemicals, and Quarrying and Mining expected to make further additions during the week of February 7th. The decreases expected in these latter two groups were, however, nominal. The anticipated increases, while not particularly large, were spread over a large number of firms, and would seem to indicate a steady improvement in most of the groups. Altogether the anticipated gains total a larger amount than has been anticipated in any week since January 19th.

Minus Industries.—Those that registered net decreases in the number of persons employed—were Building and Construction seven percent; Lumbering one-tenth of one percent; Food, Drink and Tobacco nine-tenths of one percent; Leather and Leather Goods three-tenths of one percent; Textiles four-tenths of one percent; and Railway Operation four-tenths of one percent. For the week ending February 7th all these groups, with the exception of Building and Construction and Food, Drink and Tobacco anticipated making additions, the anticipated increases in Lumbering and Textiles being larger than the declines

employment 3 were reported by Prince Edward Island offices, all within the province, as compared with 11 the previous week; 70 by Nova Scotia offices, all within the province, as compared with 104 the preceding week; 154 by New Brunswick offices, all within the province, as compared with 202 the previous week. Quebec offices reported 709 placements, of which 572 were within the province and 137 in other provinces, as compared with a total of 768 the previous week. Placements reported by the Ontario offices totaled 1934, of which 1916 were within the province and 18 in other provinces. This compares with a total of 1933 placements during the preceding week. Placements were reported by the prairie provinces as follows: 568 by Manitoba offices, 459 within the province and 109 in other provinces, as compared with a total of 629 the previous week; 331 by Saskatchewan offices, 301 within the province, and 30 in other provinces, as compared with a total of 387 the preceding week. Quebec offices reported 709 placements, of which 572 were within the province and 137 in other provinces, as compared with a total of 768 the previous week. Placements reported by the British Columbia offices totaled 832 all within the province, as compared with a total of 859 during the week ending January 24th.

In comparison with returns from the same firms for January 17th (the base week) Commercial and Mercantile, Leather and Leather Goods, Metals, Pulp Paper and Printing, Textiles, Vehicles, Woodworking, Quarrying and Mining and Miscellaneous showed increases. The largest increase was in Woodworking, Quarrying and Mining and Miscellaneous were the most substantial. Building and Construction, Lumbering, Clay, Glass and Stone Products, Chemicals, Food, Drink and Tobacco, Railway Operation registered decreases during the week of January 31st. With the exception of the changes in Leather and Leather Goods and Textiles, these decreases were all of considerable size, that in Railway Operation being the largest. Building and Construction and Food Drink and Tobacco, Railway Construction and Railway Operation anticipated having further though much smaller reductions. Leather and Leather Goods and Textiles expected to have increases during the week of February 7th, the anticipated increase in Textiles being much larger than the decline registered.

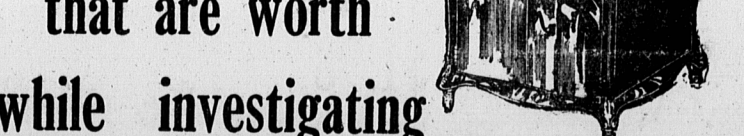
