AROUND THE FOX RANCHES

The annual meeting of the shareholders of the Chas. Dalton Silver Black Fox Co., Ltd., was held in the Kindergarten Hall yesterday afternoon.

The company's receipts amount to \$19,972.82, and expenditures to \$18,981.85, leaving a balance of \$1,890.97.
