GRAIN

WINNIPEG, Dec. 1 (CP)—A full cargo of Canadian wheat, out of Vancouver to Bombay, India, today swelled export business to 750,000 bushels and featured a comparatively brisk day on the Winnipeg market.

Sale of the cargo—approximately 300,000 bushels—was first to India since the crop-year of 1929-30 when 815,926 bushels were sold.

Values held up well all day, reflecting strong outside markets and acting on influence of the fine export business. Final quotations were 1 1-2 cents higher, December at 59 3-4, May 62 1-8-1-4 and July 63 cents.

Exporters were credited with taking No. 1 Northern in cash wheat and there was terminal demand for No. 3 pit, trading in coarse grains was active with exporters taking December and May oats. Millsters and exporters look some barley and sprayers worked rye between here and Chicago.

TORONTO, Dec. 1 (CP)—Buyers failed to follow up a moderate and spotty early advance today on the Toronto exchange and the close was a bit heavy in the industrial and golds, definitely weak in the base metals and a little higher in the western oils. Volume continued small at 413,000 shares.

The gold group harbored a single feature. East Malartic was traded in volume and the price advanced to a new high at 2.50. The close at 2.49 was up 11 cents overnight. Senior golds maintained their position and narrow gains were netted by Malartic, Goldfields, Moneta, Pickle Crow, Powell Kirkland.

Base metals were irregular. Waite-Amulet changed hands in fair volume and the close at \$8 was down 25 cents for the day. Nickel and Smelters finished 3-4 down and Noranda and Hudson Bay held to the up side. Bend Oreille, Sherritt and Falconbridge were sold for losses of 5 to 15 cents. Eldorado perked up and closed with a gain of 5 cents.

T. C. A. ROUTE COVERS MORE THAN 3,000 MILES

MONTREAL, Que. Nov. 24 —The flying distance covered by Trans-Canada Air Lines planes between Montreal and Vancouver is 2,688 miles, according to figures obtained at T. C. A. headquarters. From Montreal to Winnipeg is 1,508 miles and the rest of the way adds 1,180. The route from Lethbridge to Calgary and Edmonton is 288 miles long. With the Vancouver line, 122 miles, the total comes to 3,998 miles. Ultimately, with the main line extended from Montreal to Moncton and various "feeder" brought into service, the T. C. A. flying mileage will be still further increased.
