Grain

CHICAGO, June 10—(AP)—Wheat closed 1-5/8 lower today. 1.02 1-8-1-4, Sept 1.03 5-8-3-4; corn was 1-8-1-4 lower, July 72 3-4-5-8, Sept 74 5-8 and oats were unchanged to 1-4 higher.

WINNIPEG, June 10—(CP)—Excellent sales of Canadian wheat and flour abroad featured operations on Winnipeg grain exchange today. Although the export business failed to budge July wheat from its pegged price of 77 1-2 cents a bushel.

The sales overseas were estimated at more than 5,000,000 bushels, presumably made to the United Kingdom. Of the total, it was believed 1,300,000 bushels were taken in flour.

Buenos Aires quotations were unchanged.

Livestock

MONTREAL, June 10—(CP)—There were 192 cattle, 66 sheep and lambs, 722 hogs, and 1,061 calves for sale on Montreal livestock markets today.

Calves were 25 cents higher. Other kinds of livestock were steady to strong.

Late yesterday the best quality steers sold up to \$9.25. Today's offerings were mostly cows and bulls. Butcher cows sold from \$5 to \$7.50. Good cows \$6.75 up and common butchers \$5 to \$5.75. Good bulls \$6.75 to \$7.50 and common kinds \$5 to \$6.50.

Calves were fully 25 cents higher. Veals ranged from \$8 to \$10.50 with one lot of 38 calves averaging 146 pounds was sold at \$11.25, medium good to good calves were around \$10 and medium kinds \$9 to \$9.50. Drinkers ranged from \$7.50 to \$7.75.

Good lambs were mostly \$13 per cwt. with commoner kinds selling at \$10 to \$11 per cwt. Sheep were \$5 to \$6.50.

Hogs were firm at \$13.75 for B-1 dressed \$10.50 for B-1 alive fed and watered, and up to \$10.75 off trucks delivered. Grade A drew \$1 per hog premium with discounts on off grades. Sows were \$6 to \$8.50 live weight.

NEW YORK, June 10—(CP)—The pound sterling at \$4.02 1/2 and the Canadian dollar at a discount of 1 1/8 per cent closed unchanged in relation to United States funds on today's quiet foreign exchange dealings. (Ottawa) The Foreign Exchange Control Board rate \$99-9 1/2 per cent discount. The German benevolent mark fell 1/2 cent to 19.25 cents. The Hong Kong and Shanghai dollar fell 1/4 cent to 5.48 cents respectively, and a shade higher.

Toronto Exchange

TORONTO, June 10—(CP)—In the stock market picked up today and a more wide-spread demand was accompanied by rising prices. Turnover of 159,000 shares was the heaviest volume in nearly three weeks.

Kerr-Addison traded 9,400 shares and advanced 20 cents to 4.35, its record high price. Aunor firm's stock was up 1/8 cent to 1.60 and gains of 5 to 8 cents were noted by Chesterville, Little Long Lac, MacLeod-Cook, Mining Corporation, Pamour, Preston, Sylvanite, Teck Hughes and Upper Canada while San Antonio added 12 cents and Anglo-Ethiopian gained 15. Dome advanced 1-1/2.

Hollinger closed 3-8 down at 12, Northern Empire was up 1/2 cent to 4.50 and Hallnor 50 cents to 4.50. Wright-Hargreaves traded in considerable volume with the price firm at 4.95. Narrow losses were reported by Moneta, Paymaster,

"LET George do it," says the lazy man. Often he gets away with it. Nothing serious happens . . . until it comes to thinking!

But thinking is not only the hardest of all work—it's the most important. So when people say "I'll let George do my thinking,"

consider what happens . . . Eighty million Germans, industrious in little things, but lazy-minded in big things, said "Let George do my thinking." But their George was Hitler!

That's the way the Germans lost their freedom. Lazily they handed to Hitler their free press. Without their free press they lost the means of getting news, facts, truth. And these are the very tools by which free men do the work of thinking. Letting Hitler do their thinking, the Germans became slaves.

History has proved that no people can keep any sort of freedom without a free press. For it's the free press that helps you exercise your two great democratic rights:

1. The right to say how you shall be governed, and by whom.
2. The right to spend your money how and when you choose, and to invest your savings as you see fit.

For the first right your newspaper gives you facts, events, speeches. You get truth as nearly as it can be determined. It's then up to you to form your own judgment. But when the press

can't give you facts you lose this precious right of individual thinking and action which is at the heart of Democracy.

This is one of a weekly series of institutional messages sponsored by an informal Committee of Publishers, and appearing in newspapers from coast to coast.
