WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 15.—Denouncing Robert E. Peary, the polar explorer as a "selfish egotist," and a "braggart," Captain B. S. Osborn, secretary of the Arctic Club of America, has written a letter to the sub-committee of the public naval committee, approving the latter's action in voting down the proposition to make Peary a rear-admiral.

"The action of the sub-committee on naval affairs in the matter of Civil Engineer Robert E. Peary—not Peary—for that is an assumed name, deserves the heartiest commendation of every American citizen who values justice and respects the United States navy."

GREAT SHOWING OF THE C.P.R. FOR SIX MONTHS

MONTREAL, Feb. 15.—At a meeting of the Canadian Pacific Railway Company today a dividend of two per cent on the preference stock, and three per cent on the common stock, was declared for the half year ended December last, payable the first of April next, and it was also decided that at the same time a further sum equal to one-half of one per cent, be paid on the common stock out of the interest on the proceeds of land sales.
