JAPAN AND THE UNITED STATES

TOKIO, Oct. 31.—The report that the government at Washington will, in the event of continued discrimination against Japanese children in the schools of San Francisco, invoke article six of the Constitution has caused the greatest satisfaction here. The acute stage of the crisis has passed, and a favorable result is confidently expected from the misapprehension of Secretary of Commerce and Labor Metcalf to San Francisco. Clause two of article six of the Constitution is as follows:
"This Constitution, and the laws of the United States which shall be made in pursuance thereof, and all treaties made or which shall be made under the authority of the United States, shall be the supreme law of the land, and the judges in every State shall be bound thereby, anything in the constitution or laws of any State to the contrary notwithstanding."
