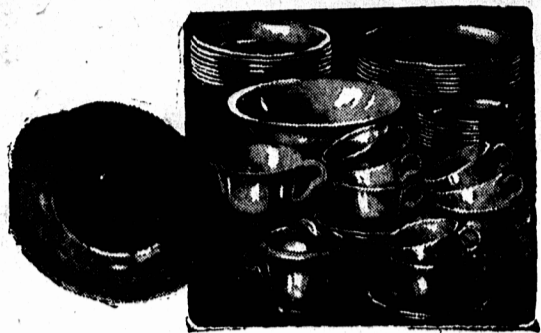

Kinkora High School Closing

The Graduation and Closing Exercises of Kinkora School held on Friday June 18th drew the usual large crowd overlooking the capacity of the Hall.
