Toronto Facing Heavy Drills In Move To Regain Pre-season Form

TORONTO, Jan. 28.—(CP)—With no more National Hockey League competition sighted for a week, the third-place Toronto Maple Leafs are faced with a series of heavy drills Manager Conn Smythe hopes will bring them back to their early-season form.
The Leafs showed signs of returning to winning ways when they dominated the cellar-dwelling Montreal Canadiens 3-1 in a scrappy game here Saturday night. The victory snapped a three-game losing streak for the Smythe men.
Syl Apps returned to the Leafs' lineup after being out for a month with a broken shoulder and was the driving force of many Toronto attacks. Although not used as much as usual, the big fellow proved he has lost none of his play-making brilliance.

Red Wings Protect Hold On 5th Place

DETROIT, Jan. 28.—(CP)—Detroit Red Wings protected their hold on fifth place in the National Hockey League standings by upsetting Boston Bruins 4-2 tonight.
Scoring two goals within 42 seconds in the first period, Detroit took a lead which it held until early in the final period. Then, after Boston had tied the score, defenseman Alex Motor drove home what proved to be the winning goal.
With 53 seconds to play, manager Art Ross took goalie Frank Ehmke from the nets and sent six Boston forwards up the ice. The Red Wings capitalized on the manoeuvre, however, Ken Kilrea snapping the puck into the empty net on a breakaway play.
Boston's goals were scored by the "Sauerkraut Line" of Bob Bauer, Milt Schmidt and Woody Dumart. Schmidt scored in the second period, and Bauer's goal deadlocked the count in the third.
Left wing Syd Abel, just up from the Detroit farm at Indianapolis, scored the first Red Wing goal at 6:42 of the first period, and the veteran Syd Howe got the other Detroit score of the period.

Canadiens Snowed Under By Chihawks

CHICAGO, Jan. 28.—(CP)—Chicago Black Hawks buried the Montreal Canadiens under an 8-1 score tonight with their youthful scoring prowess accounting for all the goals in a National League Hockey game.
A crowd of 13,298 saw the freshmen youngsters cut loose with a dazzling last-period attack that netted six goals-three of them in 78 seconds. It was the Hawks' 12th victory of the season, as many as they won all last season.
The hero of the attack was Les Cunningham who scored two goals and got assists on the other.
The battle was a hard-fought game for the first two periods. The Hawks took a one-goal margin in the first period when rookie George Allen scored, assisted by Mush March and Bill Carse. Midway in the second period Phil Hergesheimer, another rookie, rammed the puck home to give the Hawks a 2-0 lead.
The game remained on an even keel with the Canadiens continually threatening until six minutes of the final period had gone. Then Cunningham scored at 6:26. Rookie Bob Carse followed with another goal 15 seconds later, then at 7:44 Johnny Chad, still another yearling, counted.
Montreal came to life long enough to score a shutout when Toe Blake scored, assisted by Bill Summerhill and Red Goupille. Then the Hawks came right back and scored three more goals with less than five minutes to play.
Cunningham ran the Hawk lead to 6-1 with his second goal and Chad got his second 24 seconds later. Then, with only 35 seconds left, rookie Doug Bentley connected. The Hawk total tied the season's single game high for one team. Last November the Canadiens beat the Hawks 8-2.
