CONTINUOUS RAILWAY.

The Ottawa Electric Railway company has purchased the necessary plant at a cost of \$5,000 and will commence early next month to cast and weld the joints on its various lines. The work will be started on Somerset street and continued west. It is carried out at night and does not interfere with the regular service. From seventy-five to one hundred joints cast welded each night. The average cost is about \$5 a joint. All progressive railway companies in Montreal and all the large cities across the border are cast welding the rail joints on their lines.
