Government Aid For Chicken Clubs
 The Provincial Department of Agriculture is undertaking this year, as formerly, to pay \$4.00 per hundred on baby chicks for boys and girls' clubs. The club shall consist of ten members, either boys or girls.
 Chicks must be bought from Provincial Hatcheries, and whose eggs are all from blood tested flocks. Brooders would be necessary in stand half the cost of the heater for the brooder house; the balance to be paid by the owner of the club. Our Department would retain ownership in the heater for a period of three years. After the expiration of that time, the heater having been used for those three years would then become the property of the purchaser.
 I would like the people to have an interest in poultry in this province, and many who have not thought of the matter up to the present time, to realize that the money brought into the province by the sale of eggs and poultry is a very substantial amount of the present revenue of the province, and when we come to realize that it is necessary for Prince Edward Island to import six carloads of western chickens in order to supply the requirements of the province, which include the necessary product used by canning factories; so that all can see the need for increased production.
 Assuring all concerned in this matter of the co-operation of our Department and earnestly asking for an organization of the poultry growers of the province.

 Receipts: Cattle 941; calves 690; hogs 1,659; sheep and lambs 107.
 Cattle trading was active at prices that were generally estimated to be 25 cents higher. Good steers sold at \$6.25 to \$6.85 with the bulk between \$6.50 and \$6.75 and with an odd top steer weighed separately at \$7. One choice 1,000-lb. steer brought \$8.50. Medium steers were from \$5.50 to \$6 and common brought \$4 to \$5.25. Heifers ranged from \$4 to \$6. Good cows were \$4.50 to \$5 with an odd top cow at \$5.25.
 Medium quality butchers were \$3.75 to \$4.25 and common from \$3 to \$3.50. Canners and cutters were from \$3.50 to \$4.50 with tops up to \$5.
 Medium good to good quality calves were steady; while other grades were fully 50 cents lower. The bulk of the calves were of common to just fair quality and these were sold between \$4.50 and \$5.50. About one dozen good veals made \$7 to \$8 with medium good kinds around \$6.50. Common drinkers sold as low as \$4. Grassers were \$3 to \$3.50.
 A few spring lamb averaging between 40 and 45 lbs. brought \$6 to \$7 each. The balance of the lambs were last year's crop and were sold with sheep at \$5 to \$6. When sold separately, they brought \$5 to \$7 per cwt. Sheep ranged from \$7 to \$8.
 Hogs were 26 cents lower. Bacon was \$10.50 fed and watered. Sides drew \$1 per hog premium, with the usual cuts on off grades. Sows were from \$7 to \$8 with an odd sale up to \$8.25. Hogs sold on the market on rail grade brought \$14.40.

Narrow Losses Sustained On Montreal Mart
 MONTREAL, April 11 —(CP)—
 Prices bent downwards on the Montreal Stock Exchange today in contrast to the strong market at the close of last week, but the losses were narrow in most cases and interlisted stocks remained steady.
 National Steel Car slipped 1-4 points at 37 1-2 and Canadian Pacific lost 1-2 at 6. Other rails were quiet.
 In the papers, Price Brothers sold down a point at 11. Bathurst, Dryden and others were unchanged.
 Foundation company lost 1-4 at 11 1-4 in the construction, and Cement was off 1-4. General Steel was lost a fraction.

 European currencies moved broadly against the United States dollar today.
 Sterling led the advance with a gain of 1-4 cents to \$4.97 1-2. French francs, despite widespread strike threats to the new Daladier Government, rose .03 of a cent to \$1.10 1-2. Swiss francs jumped .14 of a cent, the dollar gained .06 of a cent and the beiga .03 1-2 of a cent. The Canadian dollar was up 3-32 of a cent at 99 13-32.
