JULY CANADA MONTHLY.

The new social conscience is awakening in Canada. Not only the private conscience of each individual but the social conscience of Canada's municipalities which have come to realize that they owe their citizens--all their citizens--a square deal. In an article called "Practical Idealists," Lillian Heynon Thomas writes of the new Canadian Welfare League, organized to foster the social spirit and train social workers to make every town in Canada a better place to live in.

There is a good deal of hot weather fiction in the July issue. Victoria Munro's story "Marbels for Keeps," is about a lovely small man of six, whose code of honor was unchangeable, in spite of a well-meaning mother's efforts; Mary E. Wilkins Freeman in "Seth Snow's First Sermon" tells one of her characteristic New England stories; Bonnycastle Dale writes of the ferocious Haitians who terrorized the Pacific Coast as recently as seventy years ago; Grace Hudson Love writes of a love-affair in Rome that surprised the lovers with its termination; "The Women of It" is continued; Jean Blewett in "The Moose of Dear Ting" chronicles the history of a moose that did not get shot, and throws in the quaint philology of Old Louis, the guide; Donald G. French writes a burlesque "Kirsty MacFarlane's Cow," whose \$750 worth of pure bred pedigree wasn't appreciated by aunt Kirsty; Katherine Trent describes one of Canada's forelopers and explorers, C. F. W. Rochford by name; and Edward Wallace has a story of the South African war called "In the Wake of the Columns."

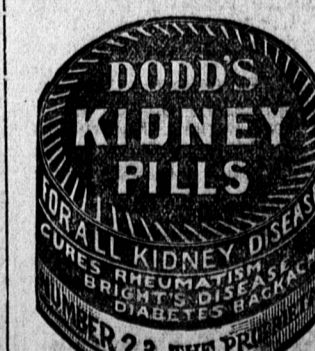
