'CHARITY BEGINS AT HOME' SAYS REV NEIL HERMAN

Preacher Pleads for Protestants to Remember the Orphanage and Hospital, and make them Among the Brightest, Happiest and Most Efficient of their kind, in the Dominion.

Following is the sermon to Loyal Orange Association:—
 Subject: "Charity Begins at Home."
 Text: "And with abideth faith, hope, charity; these three; but the greatest of these is charity."
 The following is a brief summary of the sermon:
 Love! that is the real word. "Love," instead of "charity"—and you have the key that unlocks every mystery, the solution of every problem, the cure for every disease, the balm for every heart, the calm for every storm or tempest that sweeps human life, in any climate, or under any sky.
 "Charity begins at home." That is what the ancient philosopher said, and the saying is as true today as it was a thousand years ago. We are always making the tragic mistake in supposing that love should begin with the other fellow; love should start some place other than our own home; love should burn in some corner, outside of our own place of business. If love is not blazing on your altar, you will not likely find it on any other altar in all the world. If charity does not begin in your home, you had better make up your mind that the doors of other homes will be closed against you. We have got to start right or end wrong. We cannot double-cross love and escape without scars. We cannot play loose and fast with the greatest thing in the world, and get away with the goods.

Love Begins With the Individual

I am speaking to men whose ancestors fought and bled and died. Why did they fight and why did they lay down their lives? Why? They laid themselves upon the altar of sacrifice in order that the individual might be free. They fought for soul liberty. They bled for the emancipation of the soul from every chain, from every fetter, from every form of slavery that would endanger the birth-right of the individual.
 Why rivers of blood for such an object as this? Because the soul is all we have. Kill the soul and you kill all. Because everything worth while, on earth, or in heaven, begins with you. Under God, you are the captain of your own soul. You sail your own ship—and you will sail under the increasing light of God's kites, or you will sink your craft in the deepest sea and in the darkest night that ever settled upon a human soul.
 Love begins with you. Charity must burn in your own soul. If no fire glows on your own altar, you are leader than Julius Caesar.
 "Ye must be born again. Believe in the Lord Jesus Christ and thou shalt be saved."
 We have come to a time in history when the soul must be born anew. We need soul liberty, soul rest, soul power. We need to pass from death unto life, and pass we shall when, by the grace of God, we leave our chains behind us, and become yoke-fellows with the one free man in all the ages—the man Jesus Christ.

Charity Begins at Home.

Love begins in the soul but love does not end there. You can dam the sea, but you cannot dam love in the hearts of men and women. Love will overflow all the banks, all the walls, and all the fortresses which we build to hold that holy passion from its onward sweep. The love that begins in the heart begins also in the home. Nothing is truer in all the world than the adage—Charity begins at home.
 What does love in the home mean? It means a free home! A home free from every domination that hinders or checks that free action of human souls that must always be the main-spring of true national greatness.
 When love—the love of Christ—begins at home, you have a Christian home. And when you have a Christian home, you have a happy home. And when you have a happy, Christian home, you do not need to worry about unhappy marriages or oppressive marriages or trial marriages, and the many other kinds of modern marriages, that make up the tragedies and the comedies and the anomalies of this day and generation.

I am speaking today to Orangemen. I am speaking to an organization founded upon home liberty. The Orange Order stands forever pledged against every invasion upon the sanctity of marriage, and the sacred foundations of the home. We must, at any cost, preserve the liberty of the home. The honor of the Canadian fringed must not be endangered, must not be soiled, must not be wrecked, by any power that dares to infringe upon the liberty of citizens of a free, Christian land. Keep the Home Fires Burning! And we shall keep those fires burning the more brightly when those fires are fed from the altar flames of the good, old-fashioned, Christian, Canadian home.

Making Glad the City of God. Dam your rivers, and you dry them. Wall up the rivers of your soul, and your home and soul and heart become as dry as the Sahara Desert. The love that begins in your own life, and flows out into your home, must have no dyke walls to hold back the river of love. The passion of your heart must flow into your community life, or your soul becomes the abode of bats and owls and the echoes of a mean and empty past.

Have You Made a Will?

Looking into the faces of you strong and healthy men—many of you heads of families—I wonder if you all have made wills. Or, is it possible that if in the midst of life you should be called up higher you leave behind you your business your property, or your holdings of whatever kind they are, in such a shape as to worry your loved ones, and cause them to suffer serious loss. Let the message of this morning be a practical one to you. See that you make out a will. And may I, lovingly, urge upon you, that when making out your will you will remember the orphans and the sick in your midst.

Remember the Orphanage and the Hospital.

Brethren! Let me call attention to two great institutions in our midst. I refer to our Protestant Orphanage and our Protestant Hospital. There stand monuments of mercy and healing. There they stand as beacon lights, pointing the way out of storm and stress and need. Both orphanage and hospital are struggling institutions. Struggling! I would like to write that word in capital letters, and I would, if I could, burn that word into every heart present.
 Orphanage and hospital are struggling with meagre revenues, cramped quarters, and inadequate means of accomplishing the best results. We need bigger and more efficient instruments of power to take care of our helpless children; our sick, and those who have fallen by the wayside.
 More room! More progress! More efficiency! More money! They will all come when love kindles a great flame in the heart, and the fire leaps from heart to heart, and from home to our community life. All that we need to make our orphanage and our hospital among the best, the brightest, and the happiest in our Dominion, is a little more of the Master's compassion, embodied in those channels of blessing and power known as last wills and testaments.

Lawyers and Ministers Play Your Part.

What a wonderful part could our lawyers and ministers play in this fine program of health uplift and restoration to the highest and the best! These two men—the ministers of the Gospel, and the servant of the law—these two men who so frequently have the ears and the hearts of men of substance, could perform a service of great blessing by turning the thoughts of will-makers to our hospital and orphanage.
 Blessings upon the heads of all such, who minister to little children, and those who find a hospital necessary to recover health and strength.

Never Let the Old Flag Fall.

There are those within the bounds of the British Empire, who find themselves restive, irritated and angry, under the folds of the Union Jack. They want to haul down the old flag. Selection of Diet In Tuberculosis

NO. 18
 In our last article mention was made of foods in general. Malnutrition may be due to both lack of food—or Poor Selection and applies to the rich and poor alike.
 A simple balanced diet for a day should consist of—
 Breakfast—Some fruit, Orange, apple, prunes or grapefruit. Cereal—Oatmeal, wheat products or barley. Egg—if one can afford it. Milk, weak tea or coffee, with milk, toast or bread.
 Dinner—Meat or fish. Vegetable, carrot, turnip, squash or cabbage, always one green vegetable if possible. Dessert.
 Supper—Cold meat or macaroni, preserved fruit, milk.
 This simple diet contains all necessary food products and can be secured cheaply. Poorly selected diets often make the body more susceptible to disease, especially diseases of the tissues such as TUBERCULOSIS.
